First Day of School and Bell Schedule

The first day of school is Thursday, August 8, 2024 and it is a Brown Day (Periods 1, 3, 5 and 7). We currently have a block bell schedule which is based on an 8-period master schedule. Students attend 4 classes a day, rotating daily with either a Brown or Gold Day Schedule (included in this packet). On a Brown Day, students attend periods 1, 3, 5, and 7, and on a Gold Day students attend periods 2, 4, 6, and 8. See the Bell Schedule below.

Each student is assigned to a Grizzly Learning Center (GLC) during Period 7 on Brown days where they will complete or receive help with their classwork, study and prepare for exams, make-up tests and get overall support from their teachers in all content areas. Students will also receive support for their social-emotional development. Additionally, most students in Grades 9 and 10 have a second Learning Center period (2, 4, 6 or 8) on Gold Days. Students are expected to utilize their time wisely to complete their work. Our goal is to meet our students' needs by providing them with support during the school day rather than before or after school. We understand our students have obligations after school and want to make sure they receive the services they need to be successful. We expect students to utilize time wisely during the Learning Center periods, study and pass their classes with a grade of C or better the first time the class is taken.

Class Schedule Distribution Dates:

All students will be expected to pick up their class schedule **prior to the first day of school.** The Schedule Pick up date is Wednesday, July 31, 2024 during their designated timeframe by grade level (see below). It is a great time to catch up with friends and pick up schedules. In addition to picking up class schedules, students will take pictures for the yearbook and student ID cards, purchase PE uniforms, purchase ASB packages, clear debts, purchase locks for student lockers (if they don't already have a locker), and purchase new "Grizzly Gear" items (i.e. sweatshirts, T-shirts, shorts). Students need to come prepared to have their picture taken and will have the opportunity to purchase their school photo.

Incoming Freshman (Grade 9) students (see the flyer included in this packet):

Grade 9 students will report to the Main building/Forum for Freshman Orientation. There is a mandatory informational meeting for parents of incoming Grade 9 students where we introduce you to our school and share our expectations for learning. This will be on **Wednesday**, **July 31 from 8:30 – 9:30 am** in the **Theater**. Parents may leave at 9:30am and come back to pick up their child at 12:00pm.

Incoming Grade 9 students will participate in an Orientation and Campus Tour facilitated by our Link Crew students on **Wednesday, July 31, 2024 from 8:30am-12:00pm**. They will also take their ID pictures, purchase PE uniforms and locks for lockers, etc.

Items to Purchase if needed during Schedule Pick Up Day:

PE Clothes - \$15.00 for shorts, \$15.00 for shirts, \$30 for both.

Cash, Check or Credit Cards accepted (Apple Pay OK)

NO Venmo, PayPal, Cash App, or Zelle.

Seniors will need take their Senior Portraits for the Yearbook at Prestige Portraits. Seniors will receive an email through the personal email address on file with instructions to schedule an appointment to take the portrait at a studio. No Senior Portraits will be taken on campus this year.

Dress Code Expectations at Gunderson High School:

Please remind students to dress appropriately for school. Student attire and grooming must permit the student to participate in learning without posing a risk to the health or safety of any student or school district personnel. Please refer to the SJUSD Parent/Student Handbook for more information. Students must wear clothing including both a shirt with pants or skirt, or the equivalent (for example dresses, leggings, or shorts) and shoes.

- a. Clothing must cover the chest, torso, and lower extremities.
- b. Clothing must cover undergarments.
- c. Clothing must not be see-through.
- d. Professional sports attire may not be worn except for special occasions determined by the principal.
- e. Clothing must be suitable for all scheduled classroom activities, including physical education, science labs, shop classes, and other activities where unique hazards or specialized attire or safety gear is required.
- f. Baseball caps / Beanies / Hoodies are not worn inside the classroom.
- g. Pro Club attire is not to be worn at school or school-sponsored events.

Attire or grooming depicting or advocating violence, criminal activity, gang-related activity (including professional sports wear and/or colors identified by the Santa Clara County Sheriff or San José Police

Department as gang-affiliated), use of alcohol or drugs (ex. Cookies brand, ESSJ, a Red Sharks logo), pornography, or hate speech are prohibited.

Students who are not dressed appropriately may be required to change their clothing. Therefore, it is imperative that the above dress code is followed.

A change of clothing is required for physical education classes. Students must dress in Gunderson PE uniforms or black shorts and a grey shirt. During cold weather, students are allowed to wear sweatpants/sweatshirts. Shoes must be athletic, rubber soled, lace-up. Students may purchase PE uniforms when they pick up their class schedules.

Cell Phone Policy

Review the School-wide Cell Phone Policy included in this packet. Students **cannot** use their cell phones and/or earbuds in class. They may use it during passing periods and break. Students need to keep their cell phones off and secure inside their backpack or in their student locker. The students must bring their school-issued Chromebook to class daily so they do not need their phones during class time. Students also have access to calculators in most of their math and science classroom or can check one out from the Grizzly Center (Library).

We want students to use the bathroom during the scheduled breaks. If the student requests a pass out of class to use the bathroom for an emergency, then they cannot take their cell phone with them. They must leave it in the classroom with the teacher.

If you have an emergency, please call the front office. They will assess the nature of the call and provide support to you if you need to get in contact with your child regarding an urgent matter. If it's not an emergency, please send your child a text and they can check the text message during the passing period, break or at lunch.

Student learning is our priority, and we are committed to insuring students are on task and engaged in the classroom.

Student Drop-off

Please enter the school from the entrance on Chynoweth Ave. Drop students off at the loading zone in front of the school. Students can enter campus through the Plaza or the Front Office beginning at 8:00am. Students are not allowed to enter campus prior to 8:00am.

Do not enter through the staff parking lot on Gaundabert to drop students off at the N/T wing. Only staff members are allowed in that parking lot. Students with special needs are often dropped off at the bus loading zone and need to walk through the staff parking lot to get to their classes. Student safety is of utmost importance.

Student Breakfast/Lunch

All students are provided with free breakfast and lunch from our School Cafeteria. Students with a student ID will go to the front of the line, scan their ID, and get their food quickly. Please encourage your child to always carry their school ID with them. We are a closed campus, and students are not allowed to leave campus. Do not drop off food for your child. Students are not allowed to order Door Dash or use any such vendor while at school. These orders may be confiscated and available after school in the front office. We want to ensure the safety and well-being of all of our students.

Student Lockers

Lockers are available for all students. Lockers have a school-issued lock and will be assigned to students. Students will have the same locker for the duration of their time at Gunderson High School. The locks cost \$10.00 (one-time fee) and can be purchased at Schedule pick-up days or once school begins during brunch or lunch in the Student Store. Students are not allowed to share lockers. Every student who uses a locker must have their own.

Schedule Change Request Process:

Students may submit a schedule change request only for the specific reasons listed below. We will post the Schedule Change Request Google Form on the Gunderson website under Learning and Academic Support or accessing https://gunderson.sjusd.org/learning/college-career/academic-support on the same day that schedules will be distributed to students. Students will be notified if there is a change to their schedule. They should follow their original schedule unless given a new schedule.

The deadline for requesting a schedule change is <u>Tuesday</u>, 8-13-24. If a student's request is approved, a new schedule will be delivered to the student in class. Requests will be considered ONLY for the following reasons:

- 1. Student has not been assigned the minimum number of academic classes (4 for seniors, 5 for juniors, 6 for sophomores and freshmen)
- 2. There is a gap in the student's schedule.
- 3. Student is assigned a class they previously passed (in summer school, college classes, etc.).
- 4. Student has not met the prerequisites for a specific class.
- 5. Student requires a schedule change to meet specific graduation requirements.

Please note that requests to drop courses, including AP courses, will not be approved unless it meets one or more of the reasons listed above.

SJUSD Graduation Requirements:

Students must earn 220 credits in specific subjects to graduate from high school. Students are also required to complete certain competency certifications. Community Service

To fulfill graduation requirements, San José Unified high school students must complete 40 hours of community service at approved nonprofit organizations. **Students are encouraged to earn 10 hours of community service for each year of enrollment** at a San José Unified high school, however schools may implement their own requirements for how students accumulate these hours. Principal's Coffee

There will be an opportunity to meet the principal at a formally scheduled Principal's Coffee a few times during the school year. This will be an opportunity for families and community members to discuss items of interest with the school principal and receive information about academics, school-wide programs and initiatives and upcoming events. School Site Council

The School Site Council is an important committee composed of the principal, staff, students, and parents/guardians who are responsible for the development of the School Plan for Student Achievement and oversight of certain funds. The School English Learners Advisory Committee (SELAC) is a subcommittee of the School Site Council and is responsible for advising the principal and the staff on a plan to support students who are English learners at our site. CELL PHONE POLICY

Show Grizzly PRIDE - Keep your cell phone out of sight inside the classroom

Cell phones may be used during passing periods and breaks.

Cell phones, earbuds/airpods, headphones, smartwatches must be **OFF** and in your backpack or locker during class time.

*Unless permitted to use by your teacher for an instructional purpose

| | Teacher Responsibilities |

| 1st attempt | Reminds students as they are walking into the classroom door to put all cell phones away in their backpack, pocket chart or bin. |
| 2 nd attempt | Redirects and warns individual student to put cell phone away if it is out once inside the room. |
| 3 rd attempt | Confiscated by the teacher and returned to the student at the end of the class period. (If this occurs again on a different day, then jump to Admin, 1st consequence.) |

| | Administrator Responsibilities |

| 1 st consequence | Confiscated by the teacher and given to the Front Office staff member. Student may pick up after school from the Front Office. |
| 2 nd consequence | Confiscated by the teacher and given to the Front Office staff member. Parent/Guardian must pick up after school from the Front Office. |
| 3 rd consequence | Confiscated by teacher and given to the Front Office staff member. Parent/Guardian must pick up after school from the Front Office. Admin-Parent conference and Restorative activity. |

^{*}Consequences may be adjusted based on the needs of an individual student.





Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. Families can also advocate for resources to help students learn if they cannot attend in-person.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your teen maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and non-Covid-19 related medical appointments during the school day.
- Keep your student healthy, and if you are concerned about Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your teens must stay home because they are sick or in quarantine, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage your teen to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Notice and support your students if they are showing signs of anxiety.

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- Check on your teen's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- · Seek help from school staff, other parents or community agencies if you need support.

- 1. Have a daily routine beginning with Sunday nights. *Mantenga una rutina diaria empezando con los domingos.*
- 2. Have consistent bedtimes for children and parents on all nights. *Mantenga un tiempo fijo de acostarse para usted y sus hijos.*
- 3. Go to bed and get up at the same time on weekdays and weekends.

- 4. Put clothes out in the evening for school the next day. *Aregle la ropa para la escuela la noche antes*.

- 6. Have backpacks and shoes together by the door from which you leave. *Pon tu mochila y tus zapatos juntos cerca de la puerta por donde salgas.*
- 7. Have nighttime rituals like reading to children before bed. *Mantenga una rutina, como leyendo, con sus hijos antes de acostarlos.*
- 8. All children should have their own alarm clock and be taught to set it. *Todos los niños deben de tener un reloj de timbre y deben de saber como usarlo.*
- 9. Get up 15 minutes earlier than usual and increase the number of minutes until you find the right time to get up to be on time for school.

- 10. Get to school at the earliest time allowed at your school.

ATHLETIC CLEARANCE/TICKETS TO PLAY:

- All athletes will need to receive athletic clearance/tickets to play to start practicing on
 the first day. On the official day of practice, all coaches will be provided a list of
 students that have received athletic clearance to participate on the first day of
 practice/tryouts. Students that start after the first day of practice will need to receive a
 Ticket to Play from Mr. Chew to give to their coaches on their first day. To get receive
 athletic clearance and a ticket to play, you will need to complete the following:
 - AKITIVATE (Formerly known as Register My Athlete): All athletes need to have their <u>Aktivate/Register My Athlete</u> completed in order to participate in any Gunderson Athletic activities. Students will only receive clearance to play on the

first day of practice, if their Register My Athlete accounts are fully completed. Please make sure to complete the following on Akitvate/Register My Athlete:

- Register with specific team you are joining for the 2023-24 school year.
- Emergency Contact Info is completed including medical insurance.
- All online documents and electronic signatures are agreed to and completed by students and parents.
- SPORTS PHYSICALS:
 - Sports physicals are required to participate on the first day of practice. Sports physicals are valid for one calendar year.
 Sports physicals are not required for summer workouts but are highly recommended for incoming 9th graders.
 - All completed sports physicals will only be approved if they have a doctor recommendation regarding "unlimited participation" (See page 2 of physical form), doctor stamp and a doctor signature with date.)
 - Please upload your completed sports physical form to RMA or email your completed physical form to Mr. Chew at <u>bchew@sjusd.org</u>. You can download a blank sports physical form from Aktivate or by <u>clicking this link</u>.
- GRADE CHECKS: All athletes will go through a grade check to ensure that the requirement of a 2.0 GPA is fulfilled to play in their season and start practice on the first day. Grade checks will be completed on the most recent grading period depending on the season start date. Fall Sports grade checks will be based on Semester 2 grades from last year. All incoming 9th graders start eligible for the start of the Fall season.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Any students that transferred to Gunderson meaning you were not here for the entire academic year of 2023-24 (excluding current 9th graders) need to email Mr. Chew at bchew@sjusd.org. You will need to fill out transfer paperwork regarding your transfer and receive clearance from CCS before being allowed to participate. Please reach out to Mr. Chew so we can submit your paperwork as soon as possible.
