## BDF(LEGAL)



In addition to its other duties, the SHAC shall submit to the board, at least annually, a written report that includes:

- Any SHAC recommendation concerning the district's health education curriculum and instruction or related matters that the SHAC has not previously submitted to the board;
- 2. Any suggested modification to a SHAC recommendation previously submitted to the board;
- 3. A detailed explanation of the SHAC's activities during the period between the date of the current report and the date of the last prior written report; and
- Any recommendations made by the physical activity and fitness planning subcommittee
- 5. The manner of communicating to the public applicable information about the District's wellness policy and plan.

Education Code 28.004(m)

# SHAC Meetings 2023-2024



In accordance with HB 3908 and EHAC(LEGAL) - requires annual instruction in the dangers of opioids, including addiction to and abuse of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl [grades 6-12]:

- Reviewed Fentanyl Awareness Initiatives and Curriculum
  - M-COPE
  - Natural High
  - Everfi
- SHAC found all three curricula contained material appropriate for grade levels recommended and relevant to legally required instruction.



# SHAC Meetings 2023-2024



In accordance with (TEC) §37.0832 (requires instruction in bullying prevention), FFEB[LEGAL] (requires best-practice student programs for suicide prevention) and TEC §29.906 (requires integration of positive character traits and personal skills into the skills taught in grades K-12):

- Reviewed Suicide/Bullying Prevention and Character Education Programs:
  - Hope Squad
  - Council on Recovery
  - QuaverReady
- SHAC found all three programs were age-appropriate and contained highly engaging lessons relevant to legally required instruction



#### **Sub-Committee Focus**



- Mental Health:
  - Refresh the SHAC webpage to include more links to mental health resources in order to provide easy access for parents and students
  - Review resources for suicide prevention
- Physical Fitness:
  - Revise Wellness Policy to recommend:
    - Intermediate Campuses offer recess on a daily basis when feasible
    - Elementary Campuses offer 20-30 minutes total recess time throughout the day



#### Wellness Plan Revisions



- Increase amount of recommended recess time when feasible
- Recommend recess time for all intermediate students
- Revised provision about "requiring" Health class to "encouraging" students to take a Health elective based on District policy change
- Added recommendation to post information about healthy sleep habits on the SHAC webpage



## Other Topics Discussed



- Increasing awareness of Parent University through link on SHAC webpage
- Cell Phone Policy while not a topic parents chose for focus this year, discussed future opportunities to involve other committees to explore better ways to enforce policies in place or revise policies – perhaps a parent/teacher survey for next year
- Restricted Health Content Modules (Grades 9-12) reviewed number of participants in non-required modules (1,358 students as of May 1, 2024)
