
Don't forget if you have medication in the clinic it must be picked up by someone 18+ prior to the last day of school!

TSI TESTING

The TSI Test is a college readiness exam, designed to help colleges determine if you are ready for college-level coursework in reading, writing and mathematics.

If you plan to take ACC Dual Credit through WHS, you will need to take the TSI Test. This is open to anyone who wants to take it.

WHS is offering the TSI on several dates throughout this semester. This will be offered during the school day, starting at 8:15am on the following dates:

5/21.6/11.

Students are responsible for all work missed from class and should communicate ahead of time with their teacher!!

The TSI Test will be given at the Scudder campus and can accommodate up to 25 students at each testing session. The cost of the test this year is; Full TSI Test (reading, writing, math) - \$20 and each individual part - \$7.

Sign-up by doing 2 things:

1 - Pay through the webstore at this link.

2 - Fill out this Google form.

You will only be registered to take the test if you do BOTH steps above.
