





Message from Principal Wilkes

Our last pep rally of the year was today to celebrate and cheer on our UIL Academic Teams, Speech and Debate, One Act Play, Choir, Texan Band, Color Guard, and Texan Stars as they head into their district competitions, not to mention our spring sports that are in full swing. I look forward to their success in district competition and beyond! Congrats to the Texan Basketball Team on a great season. I know it did not end as they wanted, but we are proud of them. Their grit and tenacity exemplify the Texan Way.

I would like to update you on the Prom 2024 scheduled for April 6th at The Videre Estate in Wimberley. Parents have expressed concerns about the number of people in town due to the solar eclipse on the 8th and Market Days on that weekend. The Village of Wimberley has communicated that there will be an increase in traffic on the 6th due to the number of tourists coming into the area and the fact they will have the square blocked off for the entire weekend and access to restaurants will be limited. Prom is one of those quintessential events for our junior and senior students, and we want to do everything possible to ensure they have a great experience.

We have looked at moving prom to another date, but due to various reasons, it was not possible. The Videre Estate has been working with us to provide options for our students should they not be able to find a restaurant to enjoy before Prom, and I am pleased to announce that they can provide dinner for students if they choose. Basic Prom tickets are \$50 per student and include hors d'oeuvres, desserts and refreshments. The meal, if you choose to purchase it, would be an additional \$25 per ticket. The chef is still finalizing the time of the meal and menu, but it may include a choice of chicken alfredo or brisket and sausage.

If your student prefers to eat at a restaurant, I suggest booking reservations early. Another option may be hosting dinners for groups of students at private residences. Regardless, please prepare and plan for traffic so your student can arrive at prom on time. The dance is from 7:30 to 11:30 pm, and students are expected to arrive no later than 9:00 pm. More information and Prom invitations will be coming



TSI TESTING COMING SOON

The TSI Test is a college readiness exam, designed to help colleges determine if you are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics.

If you plan to take ACC Dual Credit through WHS, you will need to take the TSI Test. This is open to anyone who wants to take it.

WHS is offering the TSI on several dates throughout this semester. This will be offered during the school day, starting at 8:15am on the following dates:

3/19, 3/26, 4/30, 5/21, 6/11.

Students are responsible for all work missed from class and should communicate ahead of time with their teacher!!

The TSI Test will be given at the Scudder campus and will be able to accommodate up to 25 students at each testing session. The cost of the test this year is; Full TSI Test (reading, writing, math) - \$20 and each individual part - \$7.

You will only be registered to take the test if you do BOTH steps above.

HOW DO I USE THE \$5 VOUCHER CODE?

Enter the voucher code provided during the checkout process on MyACT to receive \$5 off a new ACT registration. This code cannot be combined with any previous promotional offers or discounts, cannot be transferred, and cannot be redeemed for cash or credit.

HOW DO I USE THE \$9 TEST INFORMATION RELEASE (TIR) PROMO CODE?

Place the TIR in your cart and enter the TIRP youcher code provided during the checkout process in MyACT to receive \$ off. This code cannot be redeemed for cash or credit. If you are also registering for the ACT test with the \$5 voucher code, you will need to order your TIR in a separate transaction to use the TIRP

HOW DO I RECEIVE ACCESS TO THE FREE KAPLAN EVENT?

Registration for the April ACT grants automatic access to the Kaplan event You will receive your registration confirmation in April.

WHAT IF I'VE ALREADY

April ACT test, you can use the \$5 voucher code to receive \$5 Gf an ACT test registration for the June or July 2024 test dates. If you have already registered for the April test but have not yet purchased a TIR, you can log in the TIR separately and use the \$5 eff promo code. WIMBERLEY COMMUNITY CIVIC CLUB - FINANCIAL AID

The Wimberley Community Civic Club offers financial aid to college-bound Wimberley and KAPS students.

Eligible students must attend school within the Wimberley ISD limits. This includes home-schooled students.

Applications will be considered for a traditional university or for a qualified non-traditional institution of higher learning, such as a trade school, culinary or art institute.

The deadline to apply is March 27, 2024.

Questions must be directed to WHS or KAPS school counselors. WCCC members are not allowed to discuss scholarships with applicants or parents.

If a student is awarded a scholarship, they must show WCCC proof of enrollment in their intended university or trade school by August 15, 2024 such as a copy of a school ID or class schedule.

If an applicant fails to comply with this requirement, their scholarship monies will be forfeited.

HOW TO REGISTER

1. PROMOTE THE PROGRAM

3. SELECT YOUR SCHOOL'S AMBASSADOR(S)

Keep in mind that your selection process should not be based on students' leadership potential - not their gender, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, or GPA School may register up to five students, not including

4. NOMINATE SELECTED STUDENTS

Collect the student's basic information using the attached form. Then, use your HOBY school ID to access our <u>secure online portal</u>. To nominate students, you'll only need to provide basic contact information for the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s).

*Tip: Messages to students' school email addresses often go to spam folder. Ask students for a personal email address that they check regularly.

5. STUDENT COMPLETES REGISTRATION

Once your school's nomination has been submitted, the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s) will receive a notification of the nomination and instructions for completing their registration. The student can complete the registration with their parent(s)/guardian(s); alternatively, you can complete the registration for them by clicking on the link provided.

6. PAY THE REGISTRATION FEE

Registration is finalized when payment is received. Fees can be paid by the school or by parent(s)/guardian(s).

ELIGIBILITY AND ATTENDANCE

Only current high school sophomores are eligible to attend. Students must be present for the entire seminar, including overnight.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Housing and meals for the duration of the seminar are included in the price of the registration fee. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the seminar.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Schools with eligible students may apply for a full or partial fee waiver on behalf of their student. Details about the scholarship application process will be available in November

CURRICULUM AND PROGRAM

HOBY's Leadership Seminar curriculum follows the Social Change Model of leadership and integrates the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals. Throughout the weekend, ambassadors will attend presentations by motivational speakers, distinguished panelists, and community leaders. In addition, they will participate in activities and service projects designed to help them develop their personal, group, and societal leadership abilities.


