



# **How to Design Perfect Yearbook Ads for Seniors**

Designing yearbook ads for seniors is an exciting and creative process. But at the same time, you may be having a tough time coming up with ideas for yearbook ads that express the message and emotions you want them to convey.

Luckily, Josten's website gives you plenty of ways you could put together memorable senior yearbook ads, and there's really no wrong way of showcasing your appreciation for the senior in your life on a yearbook dedication page.

# FAQ's

# CAN I SAVE MY PHOTOS AND TEXT AND RETURN TO COMPLETE THE AD AT A LATER DATE?

Yes, but you may not purchase your ad until it's complete and your ad needs to be purchased before your school's deadline which is posted on the ad designer toolbar. To access any saved work, sign into your account > click on cart > click edit

# WHAT ARE THE GUIDELINES FOR UPLOADING PHOTOS?

- Must be JPEG or PNG image format (.jpg, .jpeg or .png).
   JPEG is recommended.
- No TIFF files, HEIC format files (iPhone only format), social media images or screenshots (they are low resolution) or watermarked images
- If uploading an image from a mobile device, please use actual image size.

- The designer will reject low-resolution images to ensure the best quality images.
- Minimum of 107 DPI (dots per inch), we recommend 300 DPI to size.
- Maximum image size 20MB
- Must be RGB or Grayscale
- If an image appears blurry or pixelated on your screen, please be aware it will print that way in the book.

# WHAT IF I ONLY HAVE HEIC (IPHONE-ONLY FORMAT) IMAGES?

If you would like to use a HEIC photo, we recommend doing a web search for a "HEIC to JPEG converter" before uploading images to the designer. Once your image is converted to a JPEG, you will be able to upload this image.

# I GOT AN ERROR MESSAGE STATING I EXCEEDED THE TEXT LIMIT OF THE TEXT BOX. WHAT SHOULD I DO?

The Ad Designer reduces the font size as you type to allow the maximum amount of text to fit in the allotted area. If you get a text limit message, you must use the delete or backspace key to delete some text since the font size has already been reduced as much as possible. Different fonts allow for a different number of characters so you can also try using a different font.

# CAN I CHANGE MY AD SIZE AND/OR LAYOUT WITHOUT LOSING MY PHOTOS AND TEXT?

Yes. If you choose a different size and layout during your design session, your text and photos will fit into the newly selected layout without losing your work. Please be aware the photos may need to be re-positioned and cropped. To save your ad, click the Save Draft button on the toolbar of the Ad Designer. Be sure to submit your ad before the stated deadline, after this date, your ad will be removed from our system.

# **HOW TO REGISTER**

### 1. PROMOTE THE PROGRAM

# 2. ENCOURAGE SOPHOMORES TO APPLY

# 3. SELECT YOUR SCHOOL'S AMBASSADOR(S)

Keep in mind that your selection process should not be based on students' leadership potential - not their gender, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, or GPA School may register up to five students, not including

# 4. NOMINATE SELECTED STUDENTS

Collect the student's basic information using the attached form. Then, use your HOBY school ID to access our <u>secure online portal</u>. To nominate students, you'll only need to provide basic contact information for the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s).

\*Tip: Messages to students' school email addresses often go to spam folder. Ask students for a personal email address that they check regularly.

### 5. STUDENT COMPLETES REGISTRATION

Once your school's nomination has been submitted, the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s) will receive a notification of the nomination and instructions for completing their registration. The student can complete the registration with their parent(s)/guardian(s); alternatively, you can complete the registration for them by clicking on the link provided.

# **6. PAY THE REGISTRATION FEE**

Registration is finalized when payment is received. Fees can be paid by the school or by parent(s)/guardian(s).

### **ELIGIBILITY AND ATTENDANCE**

Only current high school sophomores are eligible to attend. Students must be present for the entire seminar, including overnight.

### **ACCOMMODATIONS**

Housing and meals for the duration of the seminar are included in the price of the registration fee Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the seminar.

# **SCHOLARSHIPS**

Schools with eligible students may apply for a full or partial fee waiver on behalf of their student. Details about the scholarship application process will be available in November.

## **CURRICULUM AND PROGRAM**

HOBY's Leadership Seminar curriculum follows the Social Change Model of leadership and integrates the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals. Throughout the weekend, ambassadors will attend presentations by motivational speakers, distinguished panelists, and community leaders. In addition, they will participate in activities and service projects designed to help them develop their personal, group, and societal leadership abilities.
