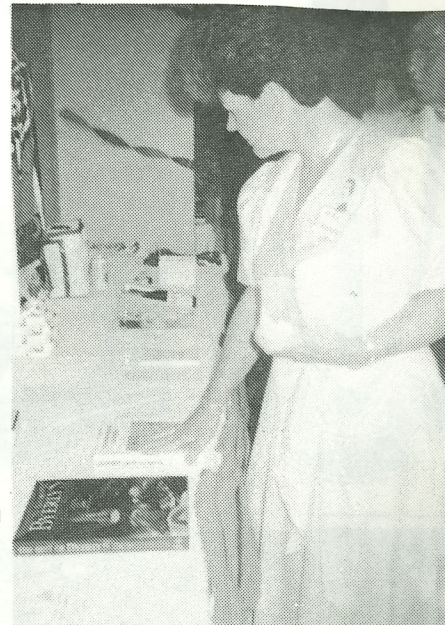

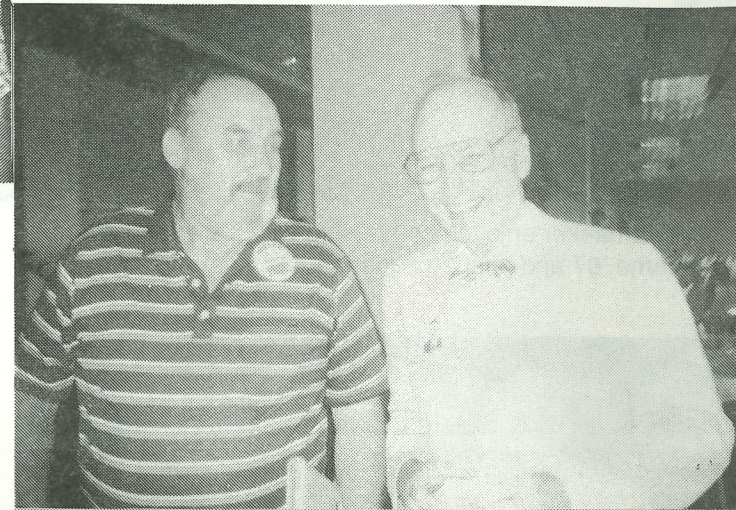

### Burrows Named Director of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Marian

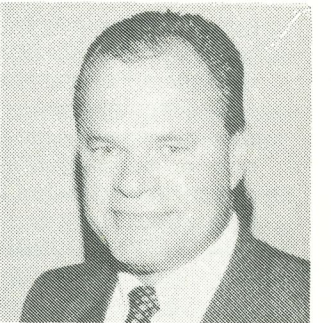

## Sioux Cityan Creates Magic

The popularity of cel collecting doesn't surprise Ron Clements.

There's magic in the likes of Mickey Mouse, Snow White and Pinocchio, says the Walt Disney animator and native Sioux Cityan. Buying a cel gives collectors a little piece of that magic.

"I see this especially with the Baby Boom generation which grew up with animated films. They have kids of their own now and those kids are reintroducing animation to them," says Clements who was an animator on "The Rescuers," "Pete's Dragon," and supervising animator on "The Fox and the Hound."

The 1971 Heelan High School graduate has vivid memories of seeing "Pinocchio" when he was a kid. "I was blown away by it." The characters, the colors, the "magic" of the film inspired him to go home and draw characters as though he were an animator, too.

"I began drawing all the time and I'd imagine that I was involved in making an animated film. I thought Disney would be such a fun place to work."

Clements did become an animator at Disney not long after he graduated from Heelan. Most youngsters, however, leave behind the excitement of those movies and forget about the animated characters that once seemed so real to them, he says.

"Now those Baby Boomers are coming back to animation through their kids and that's one of the reasons that we've seen a revival of interest in animation during the last few years. Another reason is that there have been several animated films lately that have been very successful," says Clements.

He credits "Roger Rabbit," "American Tail,"

and "Oliver & Company" with bringing audiences back to full-length animated films. Too, videotape releases of classics, such as "Lady and the Tramp," and "Cinderella," have broadened audiences for the genre.

"Those films are incredible works of art — American art, and I think more people are becoming aware of that," says Clements. "People go a long way back with Disney — all the way back to their first memories of being a kid. There's a lot of that stored up in them that they discover as adults."

Clements' entree into the animation world came when Disney started a training program for artists in 1974. After arriving in Los Angeles from Sioux City, he worked for Hanna-Barbera (the creators of Yogi Bear), and took art classes.

"Disney hadn't recruited for years and these same animators were getting close to retirement. They realized that if they wanted to make more animated films, they'd have to bring in more people and train them."

Clements, whose current project is "The Little Mermaid," found that the animator's job was basically the same as it always had been; it remains so today. He creates pencil drawings on paper. The drawings are outlines of characters in various stages of action. The drawings then are traced onto acetate (the cel), a transparent material. Next, colored inks are applied to the cel's reverse side.

"The cel is photographed over a painted background and that's what you see on the screen — the cel with the background. Nobody sees the original drawings except the animators. All of that's stored in Disney's morgue for animated films," says Clements.

Years ago, artists transferred the outline from paper to celluloid by hand. Xerox introduced a process in the early '60s that photomechanically transferred the drawing to the cel. Clements expects a new computer process to be introduced soon: It will transfer the drawing and the color, then create a composite with the background.

"But even when that happens, the animator

### Brogan Named Fellow IEEE

William L. Brogan, Class of 1953 was elected a Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

The election comes following Brogan's contributions to filtering and control theory, its implementation in practical applications, and for related educational programs.

The award makes Brogan only the second IEEE fellow in the State of Nebraska. He is a professor of electrical engineering at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln, and is a consultant and lecturer for several national firms in the aerospace and process control industries.

will still be doing the same thing — doing pencil drawings on paper. It's the process of getting the drawing on film that would change."

New computer technology, Clements points out, would end the use of cels. That's likely to make them more valuable than ever, he says. "I'm not a collector but I do have some cels from films that I've worked on. It's nice to have a little piece of a movie."

At Disney, animators have no rights to their drawings, says Clements. They are allowed to buy two cels at discount prices from films they've worked on, and they have first pick.

"There's more and more money in cels these days. Sometimes when I'm wandering through a gallery or the cel shop at Disneyland, I look to see if there's one that I did and that's fun. Sometimes when I'm working, I think that somebody may be hanging this on their wall. It's not the primary thing on my mind, but it's fun to think about."

Clements made his first animated film when he was a student at Heelan. His formal training came during the intensive apprenticeship at Disney. The artist declines to recommend one mode of training — college or the apprenticeship — for students. But he does point out that character animation is rarely offered as an emphasis in university art departments. California Institute of Arts, Valencia, has a fine character animation program, he says.

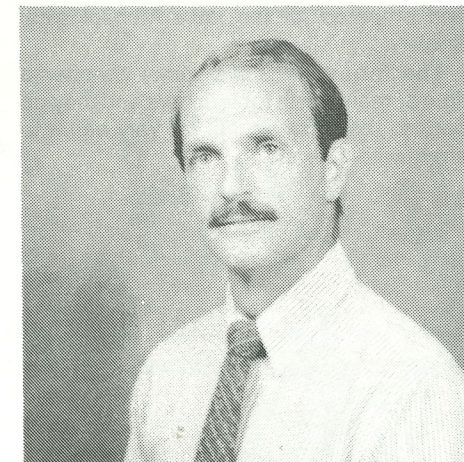

a cable accidentally contacted a live transformer terminal. The contact sparked electrical arcing and a fire. One fellow employee died of his injuries and the other was burned over 25% of his body. Carla suffered mostly second and third degree burns, with the most serious being on her front torso and upper legs. Burned lungs, kidney complications and infections were also confronted during her recovery and rehabilitation. Carla, a member of the Heelan Band and Basketball Team while a student, was a leading pitcher on the University of Nebraska/Omaha Softball squad in the late 70's and played league softball following her graduation.

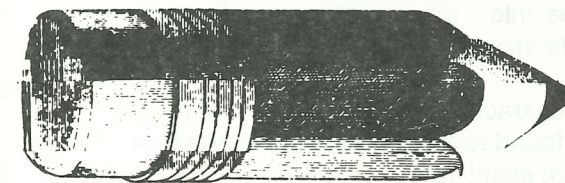
