




Fiction Book Pick



Tomorrow and Tomorrow and Tomorrow by Gabrielle Zevin

Sadie and Sam meet in a hospital in California when they are 11. They begin their friendship by playing video games in the hospital children's lounge, and from there they go through their lives together as they finish middle school, go to high school, and then attend college near each other in Boston. The book follows their relationship and gaming careers and questions all of the ways individuals attempt to make meaning in their lives, while philosophizing about the possibilities of the universe.




