You Are Awesome by Neil Pasricha



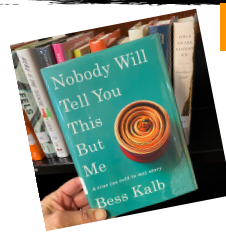
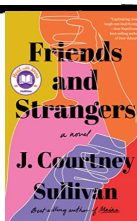
