As we close another school year, I wanted to acknowledge and celebrate some of our students' achievements from these last few weeks of the year.



Congratulations are due to our athletic successes from the Spring...runner Isaiah Mitchell placed 10th in the 100M Dash at the OHSAA Division II Region 6 Meet! He got to Regionals in both the 100M and 200M Dash and he set another new school record for the 200M with a time of 22.33 at Districts! District Finances



To keep our community informed about the District's finances, we wanted to share information about the projected revenue for this fiscal year, the Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant, and a recent award the Treasurer's Office received.



Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant Program from the State of Ohio

The District applied for and received the Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant. This grant totaled \$400,000, of which \$100,000 was to be allocated to each instructional school building. These grant funds were restricted as to the type of authorized expenditures that could be made. The District is currently wrapping up the projects that were part of this grant. The safety projects completed at each building using this grant include:

- Security cameras and video surveillance
- Exterior building lighting

LMS

JIS
