Divine Mercy Sunday is a day honoring Jesus' mercy, which was received by Polish St. Faustina Kowalska through written revelations, a now-painted image, and through the Chaplet of Divine Mercy prayer. The celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday is a time to reflect on how God's unconditional love and infinite mercy empower mankind to overcome sin and hardships. The Divine Mercy hour is a source of healing, forgiveness, and transformation for all those who are open to receiving the abundant graces that flow from His Sacred Heart.

To celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday:

Prepare your heart: Seek God's mercy through prayer and reflection.

Participate in Eucharistic Adoration: Spend time in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.

Chaplet of Divine Mercy: Pray the Chaplet, invoking God's mercy for yourself and others.

Reflect on Scripture: The readings of this day emphasize God's mercy and forgiveness.

Remember, Divine Mercy Sunday invites us to encounter the boundless love and compassion of our Savior.

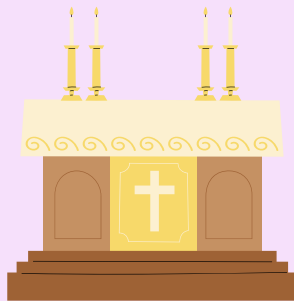

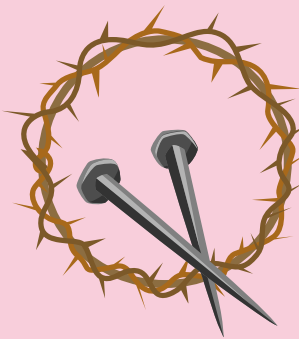
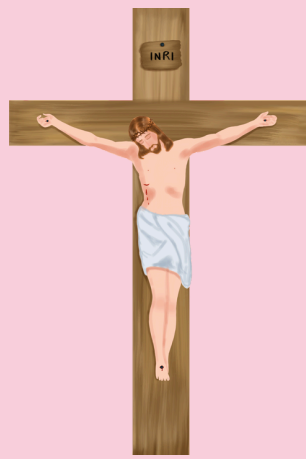

PALM SUNDAY



Our parish celebrated Palm Sunday marking the first day of Holy Week and commemorating Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The liturgy included a blessing and procession of palms and a reading of the Passion, with parts read by our priests, lectors, and congregation. The palms symbolized victory, peace, and the arrival of the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ, who brought reconciliation and goodwill to humanity.





LIVING WAY OF THE CROSS

Our St. Agnes Parishioner volunteers reenacted the powerful journey of The Way of the Cross on Holy Wednesday. It was a dramatic and moving tribute to the sacrifice Jesus Christ made for humanity.



HOLY THURSDAY



On Holy Thursday our church celebrated a mass honoring the last supper where Jesus created the institution of the Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood and gave his disciples the commandment to love and serve each other. During the mass our priests held the "Washing of the Feet" ceremony to model Jesus' humility and service. After the mass they had a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the 7 Monuments and reflected on the seven final places Jesus went from his arrest on Holy Thursday to his death on Good Friday.

GOOD FRIDAY



On Good Friday, our church commemorated our Lord's Passion, allowing us to share in His saving act of redemption. Unlike a regular Mass, Good Friday does not include the consecration of the Holy Eucharist. Instead, the Eucharist distributed during Communion has been previously consecrated and reserved on Holy Thursday evening. The Liturgy of the Lord's Passion traditionally coincides with the hour of the Lord's death, approximately at 3 p.m.

The solemnity of Good Friday is marked by silence. The priest and ministers enter in silence, genuflecting and then kneeling. The priests even prostrate themselves, acknowledging our complicity in the day's events.

Liturgy of the Word: The first, from Isaiah, refers to the "Suffering Servant Songs," prophesying a suffering Savior whose death brings redemption. The second reading from Hebrews emphasizes Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross. The Gospel is always the Passion according to St. John, presented in a dialogue format.



Easter Vigil



Holy Saturday also known as the Easter or Paschal Vigil is considered “The Mother of All Holy Vigils” because of the great significance and rich symbolism it represents in Christianity. It marks the culmination of the Paschal Tridium--ending the dark period of Holy Week and prompting the anticipation of the light and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the hope of renewed life. The main components of the Easter Vigil are the opening Service of Light; an extended and powerful Liturgy of the Word from Old & New Testaments; the blessing of water followed by the celebration of the Christian sacraments of initiation: baptism of catechumens and their confirmation (as well as Christian converts to the Church); and then the Liturgy of the Eucharist. “By most ancient tradition, this is the night of keeping vigil for the Lord (Ex 12:42), in which, following the Gospel admonition (Lk 12:35-37), the faithful, carrying lighted lamps in their hands, should be like those looking for the Lord when he returns, so that at his coming he may find them awake and have them sit at his table.” Roman Missal. The Easter Vigil is a profound liturgical experience—a journey from darkness to light, from death to life, and a celebration of Christ’s victory over sin and death.

The night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness.

The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty. On this, your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants’ hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from your most holy Church.





EASTER SUNDAY

On Easter Sunday we reflect on and renew our faith. We remember that Jesus is the ultimate bridge between God and us, and that through our shared humanity, we reach out to divinity. Easter reminds us that life is a miraculous gift, and that our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament and in Heaven gives meaning and purpose to our lives. His resurrection fulfilled His prophecy of defeating death and assuring our salvation through faith in Him. HE is risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!



God our Father, by raising Christ your Son, you conquered the power of death and opened for us the way to eternal life. Let our celebration today raise us up and renew our lives by the Spirit that is within us. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit one God, for ever and ever. Amen
