- Dropout Prevention Specialist utilized to make home visits and build relationships to deter truancy and provide additional layer of support

Curriculum and Assessment



Brazos High School provides a two tiered instruction- computer based instruction through **Edmentum** (online credit recovery program) and small group instruction (**SGI**) for students that are not meeting standard on STAAR End of Course exams. Each student, according to the State of Texas graduation requirements, must have a culmination of the correct credits in the required categories to meet graduation standard. Brazos students are expected to earn a minimum of 3 credits (6 semesters of completed coursework) in one semester. All coursework in Edmentum is given a start and end date and students can maintain the regular completion pace by meeting the dates set in the online program.

Additionally, students must achieve a passing standard on all 5 End of Course (EOC) exams in order to be eligible for their high school diploma. The EOC exams are given three times a year in English 1, English 2, Biology, Algebra and US History.

For students whose first language is not English, the Texas English Language Proficiency System (TELPAS) is required to measure English learners' proficiency and growth in English. All English learners in kindergarten through grade 12 take TELPAS each spring.
