Facilitate family-to-family support—

- Facilitating environments where families feel comfortable and respected.
- Establish a regular and meaningful communication between home and school.(Newsletter, weekly folder of student work, Facebook page)
- Identifying needs during parent-teacher conferences and facilitating communication between parents when appropriate.
- Incorporating an ice breaker at all Family Engagement Events to open the lines of communication between families. (Conscious Discipline)
- Incorporating a Family Park Playdate where families have the opportunity to meet with other parents.
- Parents are welcome to come and read to students on Dr. Seuss Day.

Establish a network of community resources-

- Providing each family with a school contact list for help with finding community resources such as help with school supplies, clothing, and food banks.
- Establishing and maintaining partnerships with business and community agencies: Englander dZign Pak, First Presbyterian, Community Bank & Trust
- Providing translators when needed.

Increase family participation in decision-making:

- Meeting with the Alta Vista Family Committee to update and discuss family engagement plan for our campus.
- Send home surveys for Pre-K activities that parents would like to do and be a part of once a semester.
- Teachers will provide reports with data from CLI Engage and provide home learning activities through the CLI Engage parent page.
- Having a space for feedback on progress reports and report cards. (Ex. What is working? What would parents like to see reflected on these reports?)

Equip families with tools to enhance learning

- Providing the opportunity for families to visit the school in advance before the prekindergarten school year. (Meet the Teacher Night)
- Twice a school year students and families are encouraged to attend field trips which normally include the Cameron Park Zoo and the Mayborn Museum.

- Providing families with skills to support students during the transition from Pre-K to Kindergarten.(Pre-K Round Up)
- Providing different events that promotes literacy and provides skills and resources to support children's learning. (Ex. Literacy Night (make and take activities), Book Fair)
- Provide a Math Night and Science Night where parents make and take activities to be implemented at home.
- Implementing a Cookies and Reading day where parents and families are encouraged to read to their children to promote early childhood literacy.

Develop staff skills in evidence-based practices that support families in meeting their children's learning benchmarks—

- The Pre-K Alta Vista team will meet once a week to discuss student progress and evaluate ways to change or enhance the way we teach our students. We will also post the summary of these meetings on our Pre-K Facebook page.
- The Pre-K team will also attend professional development meetings that will increase our knowledge of how to support our students and their families.

Evaluate family engagement efforts and use evaluations for continuous improvement—

- Promoting feedback through short surveys or phone calls to parents after a Pre-K family event and using this data to improve these events.
- Sending home activities with families after each event to do with their children that the students will return the following school week for display in the classroom.
