LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have enjoyed another great PE lesson this week. The children have been practicing their ball skills and enjoyed dribbling footballs and focusing on control. In Maths, the children have begun their new topic on time. They are enjoying reading Olga Da Polga in English and have completed narratives about why guinea pigs don't have tails! They are also working hard on their express event assembly!

Ask Me: What are the days of the week and months of the year?








Year 2 have enjoyed learning about the lifecycle of butterflies this week. and have written some great reports about them The class caterpillars have all moved to the chrysalis stage and will be in the classroom from Monday next week. The children shared some excellent home learning linked to the stages of the lifecycle.

Ask Me: What are the stages of the lifecycle of a butterfly?



Year 3 read a collection of poems from the book 'A Nest Full of Stars', writing a descriptive poem, using metaphors and collective nouns. In DT, we researched different greenhouse designs to plan our own for our prototype. In Art, we have been drawing and investigating different plants, fruits and vegetables – observing and researching different artist's botanical work and using that to work in style. As keen mathematicians, we have started a new unit – Statistics, understanding how to interpret different graphs and problem-solve.

Ask Me: what material is best for roofing a mini greenhouse?



Year 4 children enjoyed a mini sports day at Thames Valley Athletics Centre. They took part in an egg and spoon race, sprint races, a relay and long jump. The following day Year 4 focussed on fielding and team work in our baseball lesson. In the classroom, Year 4, have been doing Maths problem solving and lots of clay work. Their Islamic clay tiles and their clay figurines will be coming home early next week. In music, Mrs Harris has been teaching recorder, with some impressive results.

Ask Me: What would I see in a piece of Islamic Art?



Reception have started their final project, Moving On, this week. We are talking about transition to Year 1 and how we are feeling. We have been creating a Reception Puzzle showing that we all fit together. We have been writing about what we are looking forward to in our new classroom. We have also been playing some exciting maths games, thinking about the ordinality of numbers to 10 and using vocabulary like 'one more' and 'one less'.

Ask Me: what do you like the most about your Year 1 classroom?


