- 6. 2022-23 Preliminary Budget: @ 8:25 AM (VOTE)
 - P2P is in excellent financial shape
 - Enrollment will stay the same
 - This year's 6.1% increase in per-pupil revenue (PPR) is allowing P2P to offer strong pay increases, lease electric buses, and offer prior years' experience to existing and future teachers
 - Mill levy will increase .7% over last year
 - P2P has always been financially conservative and is in better shape to weather another economic downturn than most districts and charter schools.
 - Expense
 - o 4% pay increase for administrators, salaried support staff and 5% for hourly support staff
 - o PERA contribution increase from 20.9% to 21.4%
 - o Health cost Premiums increase to 3.5 %
 - o Dental increase to 4.4%
 - o Purchase services for BVSD increase to 5.3%
