Some BIG News for the School District of Auburndale!

I hope this District Mirror finds you all well and warm in the hopes of our imminent Spring. I am excited to update you on two initiatives that the District continues to work on. The first is that we are in the final process of the search for our new school mascot. I am also eager to share with you more information about the ongoing facilities review process and some of the possibilities we have to provide for our student's continued and growing success. Please read about both of these opportunities below. I also want to extend my invitation to you to mark your calendars for the best Art Show in the world, happening in the old middle/high school gym on May 7 and 8. While you're there you might consider purchasing a plant at our annual plant sale. On April 7 the electorate will vote for one resident to fill one position on the Board of Education. Incumbent Ms. Susan Strobel Raab has completed her Declaration of Candidacy and will appear on the Spring election ballot.

1. **Facilities Review Updates** Working to Build for the Future of our Student Success

The district has been working since last Spring on assessing our facilities and our state of readiness to educate kids for many decades to come. At the February board meeting Miron Construction and Eppstein Uhen Architects presented several options to the school board and the public in attendance. The projects presented were very exciting and included major improvements to our educational readiness and security for students. We are excited about the possibilities, which include district-wide capital maintenance needs (ex: roofs, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, etc.), possible additions to our technical education, family/consumer education, and agricultural

studies areas, a potential multi-purpose community center that would serve as a top-notch location for musical and drama performances, but also serve as shared learning/collaboration space for teachers, students, and the community. The plans presented also addressed a secure office entrance at the Elementary school and updates to some of the learning space there, as well as major improvements to the playground areas. Other ideas were renovations to the science classrooms at the Middle/High School and an externally accessible cardio/ weight room to provide for both community and student needs in a secure setting.

The Board, Administration and community members will continue to focus and prioritize these ideas in order to best meet our student's and community's most pressing needs for success. The community will then see these refined options in the form of a district-wide survey in which they can provide input on these exciting possibilities. You will continue to be fully informed as the process goes along through mailings, informational meetings, and board presentations. I look forward to talking to you more about this process.

2. **Mascot News!**

Our New Mascot Work Nears Fruition

As you know we have been working hard to give our students a mascot and a strong boost to our school spirit. The community has expressed patient understanding for the need to give our students a mascot and a new school nickname to go along with it. Through our several informational meetings it was made clear that the community would like a little more time to make the best choice on our new mascot. The board has approved "to retire the nickname/label 'Apaches' for the school district of Auburndale, with honor and respect." They have also instructed me to continue the work of developing our new mascot with strong input from current students and the community. By now you should have received my letter encouraging you to get us your mascot suggestions for an extended ballot. A second letter with a ballot included, listing the top choices from the hundreds of suggestions will be soon to follow. I am so excited about this opportunity to grow our school spirit and celebrate the respect, integrity and honor of what it is to be an Auburndale student and graduate. We hope to be able to have this work done by the April Board Meeting, ensuring time to retire our mascot at graduation and celebrate our future logo. I want to extend my thanks to the mascot committee members who met to work on this project, the student leaders who continued that work, the Board, and the many community members who showed their strong support for our students and our community by getting involved. 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
UWSP Jazz Fest

UWEC MS/HS Honor Band




YOUTH ART!



Report on Coronavirus

The World Health Organization has reported a new Coronavirus for 2019. It is called Novel Coronavirus (2019-CoV). It has been identified by the Chinese authorities. See below for signs and symptoms.

Common Coronavirus is seen in Wisconsin in the fall and winter months. However, it is not uncommon to get throughout the entire year. Most people are likely to have had the Common Coronavirus at least once in their lifetime. Young people are most likely to get this.

It is spread by coughing and sneezing, close personal contact, like shaking hands, or touching an object that has the virus on it. It is imperative to promote good hand washing and proper coughing and sneezing etiquette.

Signs and Symptoms of Coronavirus and other Respiratory Viruses

- -Runny nose
- -Headache
- -Cough
- -Sore throat
- -Fever
- -Not feeling well

-Shortness of breath, especially when at rest

How to prevent the spread of viruses

-Frequently wash your hands with soap and water -Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands

-Avoid close contact with people who are sick

-Cough or sneeze into your elbow/cover your mouth and nose with a tissue and then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands
