





# **Boys' Basketball**

The varsity boys basketball team completed their season with a 20-5 record. The boys finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the ultra-competitive Marawood South Conference. We beat Phillips and Edgar on our home floor for our first two playoff games and won the Regional Championship. Then we traveled to Wausau West and played Marawood rival Stratford in the Sectional Semis. Stratford played extremely well and we were not able to move on.

We had several players recognized for Marawood South All-Conference honors. Cooper Weinfurter was named to the 1st Team Unanimously while Fletcher Raab and Hunter Wright earned 2nd Team honors. Cody Trowbridge and Schuyler Gilhausen were named Honorable Mention. Cooper was also voted Co-Player of the year in the conference. Cooper was also voted to the Channel 7 All-Star Team for the second time and 1st Team All-State for Division 4 by the WBCA. He also had the good fortune of being selected for the WBCA All-Star Game this summer.

Cooper became our all time leader in three-point shots made with 165. The previous record was held by Colton Wright with 163. He also finished 5<sup>th</sup> in scoring, 2<sup>nd</sup> in steals, 9<sup>th</sup> in rebounding, 3<sup>rd</sup> in consecutive starts and 2<sup>nd</sup> in assists all time. Fletcher ended his career tied for 5<sup>th</sup> in three-pointers made with Matthew Nikolay at 122. Hunter finished his junior year at 21<sup>st</sup> in assists and 24<sup>th</sup> in scoring.

.Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this finds all of you healthy at the end of a most unusual school year. Kris and I would like to extend "Congratulations" to all of the Seniors and wish them the best of luck in their futures.

Here are a few reminders for the upcoming school year.

According to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services vaccination rates have decreased in the state of WIsconsin since March. If these trends continue it will have a tremendous effect on herd immunity, with an opportunity to spread preventable diseases. As the state of WIsconsin starts to reopen I encourage you to contact your local doctor for well visits and immunizations.

Please check your students immunizations with your Doctor or go to Wisconsin Immunization Registry at <a href="https://www.dhfswir.org/PR/logoff.do">https://www.dhfswir.org/PR/logoff.do</a>. Click on Public Immunization Record Access and fill out information to see your child's immunization record.

\_\_\_\_Students entering the 6th Grade will need to have the Tdap booster. Once done please send a copy of immunization to the school.

\_\_\_\_ If your child will continue to need medication at school next year, have physician fill out appropriate Medication Administration Form, with signature of Doctor and parent and

fax/bring to school prior to the start of the next school year. If this form is not filled out medication can not be given. 453.6 - MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION PROCEDURES If your child currently has a Health Care Plan, please have the provider fax new orders to the school your child will attend or bring a copy to the school office, so their Health Care Plan can be distributed and updated before school starts, as required by law. Please let us know if you have any questions. If your child has orders related to Asthma, Diabetes, a Life-Threatening Allergic Reaction, or Special Dietary Needs from their health care provider, we will need updated orders for next year. Please have the provider fax new orders to the school your child will attend next year or bring a copy to the school office, so their Health Care Plan can be distributed and updated before school starts, as required by law. Please let us know if you have any questions.

#### **SUMMER SAFETY TIPS**

Make sure children are in the proper seat in the car:

- As the child grows the seat will change.
- Infants should be rear facing until the age of 2 or longer
- All children in the back seat until they are at least 13 and can properly wear a seat belt https://www.safekids.org/
