Wrestling 2020-2021

The 2020-21 wrestling season was very different this year. We were limited to one meet a week and at the beginning of the season limited to single dual competitions. This year the team's numbers were low and due to Covid we combined with Marathon just for this season. The co-op team finished the season with 6 wins and 6 losses. Our squad had a lot of experience, which helped the individuals compete at a high level. The members included Noah Altmann, Brett Thiel, Cody Poeschel, Sloan Welch and Brice Thiel. The team will lose only one senior Cody Poeschel who will be greatly missed next season.

Our co-op team finished with conference wins against Phillips and Athens/Edgar. Due to a shortened season the Eagles entered the WIAA tournament series January 30 at the regional in Amherst where Brice Thiel earned 1st place and Noah Altmann and Sloan Welch earned 2nd place and a trip to sectionals at Valders HS. Brett Thiel and Cody Poeschel placed 3rd eliminating them from the postseason.

The next Saturday Noah, Sloan, and Brice wrestled sectionals at Valders. All the guys wrestled hard but only Sloan qualified for the state meet. Sloan earned his first trip to the state tournament by placing second. Noah and Brice placed 4th at the sectional ending their season.

On February 13 Sloan competed in 182# weight class at the WIAA State Individual wrestling tournament hosted by Wausau East High School this year. In Sloan's first match he defeated a wrestler from Westfield by a score of 5-2 advancing Sloan to the semifinals. Sloan was then defeated by an Iowa-Grant wrestler which sent him to the wrestle backs. Sloan then defeated a wrestler from St. Croix Falls in sudden victory 5-3. The victory advanced Sloan to the third-place match which he lost to a Weyauwega-Fremont wrestler 8-4 so Sloan came home with the 4th place medal and a spot on the podium. Sloan's performance was impressive because he was the only underclassmen in his weight class. The coaching staff is proud of all the wrestlers for their dedication and hard work in a difficult and strange year.

This group of kids including the incoming 8th graders with hours of hard work over the offseason, can be at the top of the conference next year. This group will have to dedicate themselves to the sport during their off time to reach their full potential and goals for next year. I have confidence that the members of this team will go the extra step to get better.

2020 Football

The 2020 Football season was clearly one of change and uncertainty. With a new school mascot, some uncertainties concerning COVID and low numbers in the upper classes, we decided to move to 8-player football in 2020. With the late change we were fortunate to fill our schedule. However, after some early successes the season schedule quickly got off track. In Week One, the football team made the trip to Sevastopol to play the 2018 8-player state champions. With no fans allowed and a surprise adjustment to the field (we played on a full sized football field), the Eagles put together a very solid game cruising to a 76-22 victory. Hunter Wright passed for two touchdowns and ran for five more. Senior Schuyler Gilhausen had two receiving touchdowns and ran one in for a score. Junior Terrence Roberson led the team with 177 yards rushing on just 11 carries. Schuyler led the defense with 12 tackles. In Week Two, the Eagles went to Greenwood and came away with an exciting 32-26 victory over the Indians. Hunter Wright passed to Alex Willfahrt in the endzone for a 28-yard touchdown as time expired to seal the win. The final touchdown was set up by a key completion of 37 yards to Schuyler Gilhausen. Many contributors on defense as we played an opportunistic game that forced several turnovers. The team showed a lot of grit and fortitude to earn this victory... it was truly a team effort.

At this point of the season things unraveled. Sevastopol was contracted to visit Auburndale on October 10th but they decided against it and cancelled. That was followed by three more scheduled 8-player games that were cancelled. Without options to play 8-player games and a sophomore class now ready to play full Varsity games, we were able to schedule 11-player opponents. On October 23rd Thorp travelled to Auburndale for our first, and as it turned out, our only 11-player game. The team was focused and ready to play as we jumped out to a 40-0 lead and never looked back as we won by the score of 61-12. Defense was solid all game as we forced 3 turnovers and registered 7 tackles for a loss. Senior Hunter Wright had a game that needs to be mentioned as he passed for 3 touchdowns, rushed for 4 touchdowns, returned an interception for a touchdown and was 7-7 on extra-point kicks. Hunter wasn't alone as the offensive line was solid in pass protection and run blocking as Terrence Roberson ran for 96 yards and 2 touchdowns. Four of the five starting offensive linemen will be returning next season and we will be expecting big things out of them and everyone else that returns. Next year's Seniors of Jesse Fowler, Terrence Roberson, and Brice Thiel will be asked to fill some leadership roles in 2021.

Looking back at the ups and downs, and especially about the way that our season ended, I think of the outstanding leadership from our seniors. As we stood on the field for our final practice before we were to play Altoona on October 30th, we received the call that ultimately led to the cancellation of the game due to COVID protocols. It was not the way we wanted to end the season but they showed class and a maturity level that was needed at that time. Those Seniors are: Schuyler Gilhausen, Kaden Hoffman, Cade Krings, Anival

Martinez, Dylan Northway, Cody Poeschel and Hunter Wright. Thank you, Seniors. With the move to 8-player, we did not have the chance for All-Conference but upon the completion of the Alternate Fall season, the WIAA and WFCA will be providing some awards and recognition. I hope that we will have some recipients. With all that said, the Auburndale Eagles 8-player football team finished the season ranked #4 in the State. The football program which includes Jr. High, Junior Varsity and Varsity combined to go undefeated in 2020. I would like to thank the players in the program, the parents, the administration and the assistant coaches. Go Eagles!

The Auburndale Tractor Club has been very busy working on plans for a Tractor Day this school year. Cross Country 2020


