We beat Spencer and Thorp on our home floor for our first two playoff games and won the Regional Championship. Then we traveled to D.C. Everest and played Marawood rival Marathon in the Sectional Semis. Marathon played extremely well, and we were not able to move on.

We had several players recognized for Marawood South All-Conference honors. Colton Wright and Cooper Weinfurter were named to the 1st team unanimously while Carter Wilcott and Hunter Wright earned honorable mention. Cooper was also voted to the Channel 7 All-Star Team.

Colton became our all time leader in three-point shots made with 163. Mike Huser held the previous record with 150. Nurses Notes

As school ends and summer starts, many families are looking at summer vacations. Checking on your child's immunizations is a top priority. Parents can check their child's immunizations at Wisconsin Immunization Registry <https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/wir.htm>. This is especially important if traveling to a state that has the measles outbreak and or traveling by airplane. It is also important if your child will be in any summer sports or camps. For states affected please check the CDC website at <https://www.cdc.gov/measles/cases-outbreaks.html>

This is a reminder to have all immunizations up to date for 2019-2020 school year. Under Wisconsin State Law, Wis. Stat. sec. 252.04, it is required to have your child vaccinated within 30 days of the start of school or daycare. If a waiver form is needed, please stop at the school office and pick one up.

If your child takes medication at school a Medication Administration document dated with the new school year will need to be received by the child's physician before medication will be given at school. Parent signature is needed as well.

If your child has a Health Care Plan, example: Asthma, Allergy requiring medication, Diabetes, Seizures or other condition, a new care plan dated with the new school year is needed from your physician. Parent signature is needed as well.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

Make sure children are in the proper seat in the car:

- As the child grows the seat will change
- Infants should be rear facing until the age of 2 or longer
- All children in the back seat until they are at least 13 and can properly wear a seat belt <https://www.safekids.org/>
- Get your car seats checked at the Marshfield Fire and Rescue Department on the 3rd Tuesday of every month from 11:00 am-1:00 pm

Make sure children are wearing proper gear for activity:

- Life jackets on while on the water
- Helmets while riding a bike
- Sunscreen of at least 15 SPF with UVB and UVA protection
