With the referendum failing in April and the subsequent uncertainty with the biennial budget, the school district is adjusting our budget accordingly. We are not replacing some non-teaching positions due to retirements and we are limiting classroom budget requests, field trips, technology purchases, staff training, and textbook purchases at this time. If the state budget provides additional funding that can be utilized for the 2023-2024 school year, these items may be reinstated. We are hopeful that the state will have a budget that will provide additional financial resources to meet the increasing costs of finding quality staff and educating our children.

Later this month or early July, you will receive a survey regarding the school district. It is intended to gather information for the Board of Education to determine strengths, weaknesses, and hopefully further some discussion and action regarding what we can do better to serve the community and students. It will be sent out via Infinite Campus to parents of our students but if you want to complete the survey and do not have students that attend school here, please contact Casey Aschebrock, Administrative Assistant, at districtoffice@aubschools.com and she will send you the link for the survey. We appreciate your willingness to provide feedback to the school board on this anonymous survey.

Strategic Plan Update

It has been approximately three months since the last District Mirror so as was promised with the adoption of the Strategic Plan in November of last year, here is the current status on items identified and addressed since then.

- All staff and students were provided a culture survey to complete that asked questions and gathered information regarding learning/teaching styles, activities, courses, and asked to identify strengths and weaknesses of our current educational programming in Auburndale. The information was then tabulated and shared with administration and the committee to build appropriate plans moving forward for next year to reinforce the positive and productive ideas expressed while developing strategies and implementing changes to address concerns and weaknesses identified. We, the administration, are currently working on such plans.
- With the wrap up of the school year and subsequent loss of employees due to retirement, transfers, switching districts, or leaving education all together, exit interviews are being conducted as a means of gathering information regarding what those employees leaving feel are strengths and weaknesses of our educational system. This is being done through direct interviews or email questionnaires.
- Evaluations were completed on over twenty-five staff members this year as required by the district and state approved evaluation plan. Another twenty-five will be evaluated again next year using the same Effective Educator framework in place.
- We currently have every teaching position filled but am hesitant to say that everyone will stay in place as it is common for movement to occur in June, not so common in July, and rare in August. We are fortunate to have a small town district located so close to larger areas where we can draw new teaching candidates in. As jobs open, they will be posted on the schools webpage, WECAN website, and Facebook. This includes any certified and non-certified teaching positions.
- I am excited to report that the work done this year in identifying learning targets and outcomes in courses this year has lead us into next year and the ability to identify within our courses, what state learning standards are or are not being met, where they are being taught, how they are being taught, tested, and more importantly, allows us to identify gaps that may exist regarding standards and expectations that may be missed. This will be a major emphasis moving into next year, especially in grades 6-12.
- We will be having a community forum with the School Board near the end of July. The purpose of the forum is to provide an opportunity for the community to share viewpoints, ideas, concerns, and other information they view as important for board members to know. As a reminder, the forum will be an opportunity to discuss items with the school board

but no actions will be taken on any items brought forward at the meeting.

- We are continuing the weight room and cardio room access over the summer months. The weight room is open 5:30-7:30 am and from 6:00-8:00 pm. Please remember that you have to sign a waiver form with the office prior to using the facility. The cardio room is open at any time and requires a key fob in order to access. The fob can be acquired by contacting the high school office during working hours.
- This spring, our new meat processing room was used to host a meat cutting and butchery course through MSTC for members of our community and those surrounding it who enrolled for the course through the technical college. It was well attended and provided an opportunity for participants to learn about meat cuts, butchering, and the industry as a whole. We are hoping to expand additional learning opportunities through a partnership with MSTC to offer courses in our automotive, woods, and family consumer education areas as well. As they become available, we will let you know.
- Be on the lookout for some aesthetically pleasing upgrades to the buildings and grounds this summer. Signs and lettering on the buildings will be painted, the landscaping and fencing around the high school athletic fields should be completed, and we are placing a flag pole at the school forest thanks to a generous donation.

That is all for now, we look forward to seeing and speaking to you again when school resumes in September!

Veterans Duck Trip

I had the opportunity to visit with the Auburndale Community Leadership Class to learn more about the Veterans Duck trip. The purpose of the Community Leadership class is to build citizenship and service learning within our school, community, and society. Students identify needs within our community and then organize and coordinate solutions to those needs. Each month of the course they organize as many as three activities in addition to organizing projects - like the Veterans Duck trip.

Here's what I learned about the story behind the Veterans Duck Trip. The Community Leadership Class invited a manager of the original Wisconsin Ducks to talk with the class. The students learned about the role the Ducks in Wisconsin during peacetime, specifically the role they played during floods. As the students listened, they became excited about incorporating the Ducks into one of their projects. With the help of their teachers at the time, Joren Anderson and Mark Cournoyer, the students sponsored the first Veterans Duck Trip in the fall of 2018. Each year the number of veterans recognized has grown from 27 in 2018 to 61 this year.

There is a lot happening behind the scenes to prepare for the trip each year. Students in 4K-12th grade create mail for the mail call for the Veterans; students are making banners honoring the veterans; the band is practicing patriotic songs; the Community Leadership Class is fundraising to cover the costs of transportation, the duck rides, t-shirts that each veteran is given, lunch and any other activities for the day. Each year Mrs. Joren Anderson is trying to find something new to add - this year she was able to add the shooting of the Howitzer as part of the send off for the veterans. What are her plans for the next Veterans Duck Trip? We don't know, but look forward to it! Reality Store Trip

The eighth-grade students took an impactful educational journey at UWSP-Marshfield attending the Reality Store! This engaging program offered them an immersive financial learning experience, fostering practical skills for life. This budgeting simulation had our students working with monthly necessities such as housing, utilities, transportation, groceries, insurance, childcare, and even cell phone plans. During the event some students received a chance factor that aided or dwindled their net monthly income such as paying for a new prescription, getting an oil change, having an emergency medical visit expense, receiving a birthday cash gift, or receiving an employee of the month bonus. Overall, through this interactive simulation, the students were faced with reality and gained insights into budgeting, expenses, and informed decision-making. They learned the value of saving, setting goals, and making responsible choices for financial well-being.

Boys Basketball

The varsity boys basketball team completed their season with a 24-4 record. The boys finished in 3rd place in the Marawood South Conference. We won our own holiday tournament with an exciting 46-42 win over Weyauwega-Fremont in the championship game. We entered the playoffs as the number two seed behind Marathon. We defeated Princeton/Green Lake 74-23 in the regional semi-final. Weyauwega-Fremont came to the Tim Anderson Gym for the regional championship game, and our boys came out on top 64-48. We traveled to Marshfield for the sectional semi-final game with Marathon. Marathon had beaten us twice during the regular season. The boys overcame an eleven point half-time deficit to win 55-47. The sectional final was played at Appleton East High School v. St. Mary Catholic(Neenah). We played a great game, but came up short, losing 75-70.

We had several players recognized for Marawood South All-Conference honors. Alex Willfahrt was voted to the 1st Team unanimously. Lucas Yeske and Caden Weinfurter were voted 2nd Team All-Conference. Mason White Eagle and Evan Scholl were named Honorable Mention. Trayton Weber was also named to the All-Defensive Team. Alex was also named Honorable Mention All-State for Division 4 by the WBCA.

We also had several players enter our list of all time records. Alex finished his career as the 11th all-time leading scorer with 940 points, 16th in rebounding with 332 rebounds, 9th in assists with 215, 6th in blocks with 66, and 10th in three pointers made with 87. Mason White Eagle finished 28th in career points with 597. Lucas ended in 29th for points with 587 and 9th in three pointers made at 90. Caden finished his junior year with 116 total three pointers made and currently sits in 7th all time.
