

723.6 – AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATION (AED) PROGRAM

An automated external defibrillator (AED) will be used to treat victims who experience sudden cardiac arrest while on the school premises and for school events and activities.

Policy and Procedure

1. An AED unit (ZOLL AED PLUS) is maintained at the Auburndale Junior/Senior High School. It is located in a properly labeled wall-mounted cabinet with an alarm system in the new gym's lobby. This unit must not be moved to a different location except by the District's certified athletic trainer, health care coordinator, or other appointed trained individual with the permission of the high school principal to provide coverage for an onsite or school campus event or events. Notation of the location of the moved unit will be clearly listed on the cabinet.
2. An AED unit (ZOLL AEDPLUS) is maintained at the Auburndale Elementary School. It is located on the wall outside the health office by the lavatories at the northeast corner of the cafeteria area. The AED unit is locked in a case with an alarm system.
3. The health care coordinator shall maintain and test the AED units' operational status (battery life, pads and electrodes) on a monthly basis. Documentation will be posted in the AED cabinets.
4. Should an AED unit require repairs, these repairs will be completed within 24 hours on site. A replacement unit will be provided should the District's AED unit be required to be transported to another location for repairs.
5. The type of AED unit and location on premises will be confirmed annually in writing to the Auburndale First Responders and Marshfield Fire and Rescue.
6. The advisor for the AED program will be the District's Health Care Coordinator.
7. The existence of the AED units in the schools shall be noted at the entrance of each building.
8. The District will not be held liable if the AED unit is used by an uncertified and/or untrained person in or on school premises.
