Although New Jersey law expressly permits the use of reasonable force to control a pupil in an emergency situation, there is no statute or code to provide specific guidance on the use of physical restraint. Policy 5561 was developed upon reviewing the current research and other State laws regarding the use of physical restraints. This Guide provides a very conservative approach to the use of physical restraint by school staff members in an emergency situation.
