DISCUSSION WITH THE HUNTERDON COUNTY INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS TO DISCUSS ELIMINATION OF THE NON-OPERATING DISTRICT OF GLEN GARDNER

- David Pellicane Inquired as to how the data that was submitted to the County was being used and commented that no savings exists.
- John Romagna Inquired about the status of the Glen Gardner \$1.1 million in State Aid and concern about losing aid if the districts DFG's (District Factor Group) are combined to an "I".
- David Pellicane Administrative costs for Glen Gardner are only \$25,000
- Steffi Decasas If merged, CPS will pay a portion of Glen Gardner busing
- Deb Broslawski Inquired about the representation of Glen Gardner of the Board of Education
- Marie Kisch Inquired about the timeline for the final decision from the State and whether the decision will be made on a case by case basis or one standard plan for the State.

March 18, 2009 **68** voted down on both occasions. Asked why it is no longer subject to a vote and may be forced by the State.
