(not to exceed \$1500 per employee)

#### **Public Comment**

- ➤ Kelly Love questioned whether Administrative Assistant would be restored if \$36,000 State Aid is returned.
- ➤ Kelly Boyd inquired about Kindergarten section to be cut. It was confirmed that there will be two morning Kindergarten sessions.
- ➤ Jill Cabot inquired about 5<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grade class sizes.
- Richard Katz responded that the class sizes will be 23-24 students in 5<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>.
- ➤ Deborah Broslawski commented on the 2.5% CAP for next year.
- ➤ Kim Toda asked if budget doesn't pass, how much worse could it get?
- ➤ Robert Pyle commented that budget presentations are being given to the PTA, Glen Gardner Women's Club, Borough of Glen Gardner and Clinton Town.
- ➤ Kelly Love asked about the State Teachers Association
- ➤ Robert Pyle responded that the Governor, with the support of NJSBA has asked for a freeze in salaries and 1.5% Contribution toward Health Benefits. The discussion with the union is ongoing.

#### RESOLUTION 2009-2010: 249 AUTHORIZATION: INTENT TO HIRE

Amanda DiRienz moved, seconded by Cara Morris to authorize Superintendent/Principal, Richard Katz, to offer employment via a "Letter of Intent" to candidates for vacancies between regularly scheduled Board of Education Meetings. The Superintendent/Principal is required to "straw poll" all members of the Personnel Committee to discuss the candidate, qualifications, salary requirements, and references. Candidates who receive three "individual approvals" will be placed on the next agenda for formal hire. Should any aspect of this process not be followed, the "Letter of Intent" is void as of midnight on the calendar date of the Board of Education Meeting. This authorization will be removed at the first Board of Education Meeting in April, 2010, where the district will return to its regular process. Motion carried unanimously with all "ayes".
