### **ART CLUB / MURAL CLUB GC CODE: dvwqsas**

In this club, students will choreograph and learn the dance together and perform it at the Cultural Heritage Gala.

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## **ROBOTICS CLUB**

The Robotics Club will focus on exploration of the robotics industry, mainly utilizing Lego programmable robotics kits as a foundation. The club will compete at the FIRST robotics competition at the middle school level. Students will construct different robots to perform different tasks as efficiently as possible.

## **SCHOOL SERVICE**

This service-based activity is for students who wish to be aides in the classroom or in other parts of the building. Students can volunteer to be trained as guides for Sixth Grade Orientation, Open House and other school-wide events. School service also runs a peer tutoring program that facilitates free academic



assistance for middle school students with coordination with South High's Academic Outreach Program. Finally, students involved in School Service will also assist in planning fundraising events, specifically Spaghetti Dinner, the proceeds of which directly benefit South Middle School's scholarship fund.

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### **SCIENCE BOWL**

Students prepare for a regional competition. Each team is comprised of five students. These teams face-off in a fast-paced question-and-answer format, being tested on a range of science disciplines including biology, chemistry, Earth science, physics, energy, and math.

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### **SCIENCE OLYMPIAD**

Science Olympiad is a club that tests students abilities in 23 STEM events related to Engineering, Coding, Technology, Cartography, Earth Science, Biology, Forensics, Physics, Ornithology, Astronomy and the Environmental Sciences.

Engineering processes may require students to build a Ping-Pong Parachute that launches a rocket into the air and returns an egg to the ground safely, utilizing a student fabricated parachute system.

Academic challenges are given in some areas of competition, in addition to lab events. In Crime Busters, teams analyze forensic data to solve a given crime.

Every season we look to return stronger, smarter and better prepared than the previous years. Our initial goal is to win the

Nassau County Title and place in the top 5 at the State Level. We are a team that works together with one goal in mind--- Success. This experience gives students the insight to see what the future may hold for them. Some may become Engineers and others Scientists. Try outs will be announced in the early fall.

## INTRAMURAL PROGRAM

Our school has a diversified program available to both boys and girls. We start our intramural program at the opening of school in September and continue it throughout the entire school year.



### MORNING

Our morning sessions begin at **7:30 a.m.** and end at approximately **8:15 a.m.** We encourage students who arrive early to make use of our facility. There is Volleyball/Basketball in GYM 2.

### AFTERNOON

The afternoon program begins mid-September and continues through mid-June (Monday through Thursday). This program starts promptly at **3:00 p.m.** and ends in time for students to take school-provided bus transportation at **4:00 p.m.** After School Intramural opportunities include **flag football, soccer, basketball, fitness and weight training, badminton, ultimate Frisbee, table tennis and an assortment of other fun-filled opportunities** designed for both boys and girls of all three grade levels within our building. Activities are based on the interest of students and we always welcome suggestions!

We encourage all students to participate in our intramural program. Activities are offered in both of our gymnasiums during various times within the school year, so everyone has an opportunity to attend different sessions. Individual assistance is always available, as is open participation and group skills instruction. We invite every student at South Middle to join us in our expanded intramural program this year. Learn about different sports and games and have the fun experience of being an active participant in athletics.

## **INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS**

Interscholastic sports are available to all grade 7 and 8 students who meet the team and physical requirements.

All students must have a physical examination by a doctor. Our school arranges for school district physicians to conduct physicals for interested students. These are generally held in early September and late June of each year. Students may also get a physical from their own doctor.

Student-athletes can take a late bus home on practice days. Teams practice every school day (unless otherwise announced). On game days, students must arrange for their own home transportation from school if the team arrives back later than the 6:30 p.m. bus.
