I hope you have all had a good week.

In my column a couple of weeks ago, I mentioned that we had a group of children travelling to Birmingham to represent the school and county in the Central National Regional Finals for Panathlon. There were 13 teams competing in this event and our determined team came an impressive 4<sup>th</sup>. They have experienced great success in all the Panathlon competitions this year and should feel extremely proud of their achievements. Mrs Kurton has dedicated significant time coaching and supporting these pupils and she could not have felt any prouder regarding how well they all conducted themselves throughout Finals Day. Each and every one showed determination and outstanding sportsmanship and they were all quick to congratulate the winning teams and applaud their victories.



Our final two year group trips took place this week and it feels very satisfying to have completed them all without encountering any significant issues or unfortunate weather conditions. Our Year 2 children thoroughly enjoyed all the wildlife on show at the Cotswold Wildlife Park on Tuesday and the only minor problem to be overcome was that one of our school minibuses decided that it was not going to play ball for the return journey and refused to start! Thankfully, there were enough spare seats on the coaches to accommodate all staff and



pupils and the minibus simply had to remain in the park's car park overnight. A huge thank you to Mr Bucknell and Mr Reid who spent much of Wednesday at the park with the breakdown serviceman and eventually managed to

get the bus back to school. Thank you also to the staff

who pushed the minibus into a suitable position so that it could be left overnight!

Yesterday saw Year 5 enjoy all Paultons Park had to offer and though it is quite a journey to get there, it is certainly worth it as there are so many rides and attractions, and queuing times are always minimal. I have always considered myself to be someone who thoroughly enjoys rides but the Cyclonator changed that for me yesterday afternoon: never have I been so grateful for a ride to finally come to a stop and I have no idea why members of my group could possibly have wanted to do it again! Once again, I felt very privileged to head out on a trip and spend time with a group of pupils who really represented the school so well. Mrs Poole has been such a key part of the Lynch Hill story and will be greatly missed. We are also saying goodbye to Miss Bason who has been with us for the last seven years. With a wedding to look forward to this summer and a new home out of the area, she has taken up a teaching post in a school closer to her new home. They are very lucky to be gaining such a good teacher. We will also bid farewell to Mr Alem who is going to be leaving us to train as a secondary school teacher, and to Miss Wilson who has supported Year 5 over the last term. A huge thank

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you to them all for the support they have offered our pupils and the lives they have touched.

With farewells to be said, we will also be saying welcome to a new teacher in year 2. Mrs Couch was in school today to meet with her new class. She is an experienced practitioner who has spent a number of years working at another local school and we very much hope that she will enjoy her Lynch Hill experience.

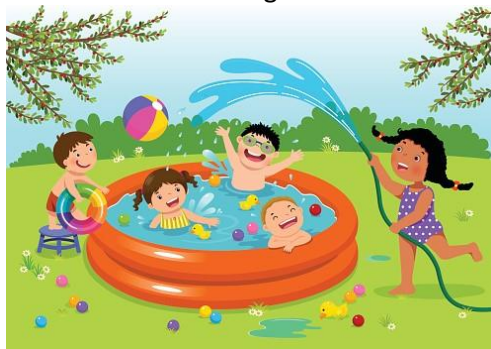

## The Cozy Reading Corner

*At our school, we want to encourage reading across the whole of the school community – and that includes our parents and carers! This term we will continue with our book reviews from/for our children with occasional recommendations for books recommended for adult reading. This week we have a lovely review from Gursukh Dhaliwal - 5B*

Last week I started reading short stories from a book my teacher has called 'Stories for Boys who Dare to be Different'. I love choosing this book to look at during morning work because it's different to other books. It's a good read when you feel very left out or different, even if you are a girl. There are 100 stories in this book. My favourite story is on page 74 and it's about Galileo Galilei. An inspiring collection of 100 stories of famous and not so famous men from the past to the present day, who went on to make the world a better place through compassion, generosity and self-belief.

## The Summer Reading Challenge

This week Reception and KS1 were visited by staff from Slough Library Service. They spoke to the children about the resources they can access at the libraries in Slough. They also informed them about their Summer Reading Challenge and how by taking part they can gain rewards. This year it is all about getting creative. Music, junk-modelling, photography, dancing, story writing, the possibilities are endless. The children can discover new books, unlock rewards along the way and achieve something amazing this summer. To join in with the challenge the children need to be library members. This can be done online ([Libraries – Slough Borough Council](#)) or by visiting the library itself either in Britwell, Cippenham, Langley or at The Curve in Slough.

Children aged 4 and over can complete the challenge by enjoying six library books over the summer, collecting stickers and rewards along the way. Those that finish will be awarded a medal and certificate to mark their achievement. The challenge:

1. Presents reading as a fun and enjoyable activity
2. Encourages children to become lifelong book lovers
3. Helps prevent the trend for reading skills to dip over the summer holidays

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4. Enhances and supports the school's reading initiatives.

The fun rewards motivate the children to progress through the challenge and it is inclusive to children of all abilities as they can choose any library books that appeal to them to count towards the challenge
