Years of start-up innovative industry experience and graduate degree will be commensurate with the rank sought. All candidates must have proven success in teaching appropriate for their stage of career.

- Assistant professor candidates must have a doctoral degree at time of application, or official notification of completion of the degree by the start of work. Assistant professor candidates should have at least 3 years of teaching experience and start-up or innovative industry experience.
- Instructor candidates must have a master's degree at time of application, or be engaged in a master's degree program of study by the start of work. Instructor candidates should have at least 2 years of teaching experience and start-up or innovative industry experience.
- The ability to teach technology and/or seminar courses at the undergraduate level including, but not limited to, current knowledge on entrepreneurship, the innovation ecosystem, and willingness to stay up to date on technology tools and trends.
- Demonstrated experience with technology solutions for a range of business and industry applications at a level appropriate for undergrad teaching.
- Commitment to a deeply student-centered approach to teaching and learning, and ability to flexibly differentiate instruction to amplify student career interests and passions.
- The ability to work effectively within a diverse community, and a commitment to creating an inclusive work environment.
