Dress Code SY25

We want Northeast Raiders to exhibit PRIDE everyday by adhering to the school dress code policy. This ensures that students are in class everyday, ready to learn. While we encourage our students to express themselves as individuals through the clothing they wear, some clothing is not well suited for school and can be a disruption to the learning environment or pose a safety risk. We expect Raiders to

- Demonstrate **RESPECT** for themselves and others by wearing attire that is appropriate for the learning environment.
- **PERSEVERE** through the challenges of peer pressure and do the right thing.
- **EPITOMIZE EXCELLENCE** by conveying a message with their attire that they are ready to learn.

Areas of Particular Concern

1. Leggings, bodysuits, and bike shorts are not appropriate attire for school.
2. Students are not allowed to wear slides to school (athletic, fluffy, etc.). All shoes should secure the student's heels.
3. Book bags must be clear or mesh.
4. Crop tops are not allowed. Midriff must not be exposed when the student's hands are raised.
5. Students are not allowed to wear hats, hoods, or "doo" rags in the school building.
6. Students are not allowed to wear ornamental grills.
7. When wearing distressed clothing, students are not allowed to have any skin exposed above their knees.
8. Skirts, shorts, and dresses must not be shorter than two inches above the knee.

District-wide High School Dress Code Policy

NON-PERMITTED CLOTHING ITEMS: This is not intended as a comprehensive list of non-permitted clothing items. The School District may prohibit additional clothing items throughout the school year. Notice regarding additional prohibited clothing items will be posted in the office of each school.

The following items are **NOT PERMITTED**:

- Leggings/Jeggings with or without pockets, Joggers with or without pockets and Yoga pants with or without pockets worn as pants
- Slides including fur slides, Crocs, shower shoes, and any kind of bedroom shoe or slipper
- No pajamas
- Sleeveless shirts Any shirt or shirt/pants combination that shows a bare midriff or skin around the waist
- Shorts or skirts/dresses that are shorter than two inches above the knee
- Bib overalls/jumpsuits Sunglasses
- Non-jewelry chains (ex: dog-collar type chains, belt chains)
- Any clothing, attire, or personal belongings, associated with gang activity or behavior. Clothing, attire, or personal belongings that are associated with a gang may be established by evidence of a common name or common identifying signs, symbols, insignias, tattoos, graffiti or other distinguishing characteristics.
- Any article of clothing that advertises alcohol, drugs, sex or which contains inflammatory, vulgar, lewd or suggestive writing, pictures, or emblems, or promotes aggression or violence.
- Any clothing, which advertises or advocates the use of a product, is prohibited on school premises.
- Any clothing which disrupts the learning process is prohibited on school premises.
- Hats, caps, hoods, scarves, bandannas, "do-rags," combs, picks, roach clips, and curlers are not permitted.
- Possession of metal picks is prohibited on school premises.
- Any accessory, object or ornament that is distracting or capable of being used as a weapon or in the use of drugs or alcohol is not allowed. This includes but is not limited to, artificial nails, jewelry, etc.
- Schools reserve the right to ban any clothing items/accessories that may present a danger or distraction to the school community as needed.
- Removable, Ornamental Tooth Caps/Grills Big shirts, jerseys or other oversized shirts.
- All other items which, in the judgment of the principal (designee), disrupt or distract from the teaching and learning process, such as dice, playing cards, laser pointers, games, toys or electronic devices.

***NOTE: (School athletes may wear school jerseys and uniforms on occasions as addressed in the school handbook). Coaches have a specified dress code for athletes on game days.**
