Eligibility: Junior, regardless of citizenship, with a strong academic record (primarily A's in the most challenging courses AND top 5%-10%) and an annual family income of less than \$65,000 with typical assets for a family of 4, who also shows strength in character. Many past award recipients have also been part of the first generation in their family to attend college.

Typical scholars are in the top 5-10% of class, >1280 on the SAT (CR and Math) or >27 ACT and eligible for free or reduced-price lunches.

Awards: Previous awards included: Full scholarships to summer programs at leading universities (Stanford, Yale, Emory, Penn, and others), individualized college admission counseling, travel expenses and room & board covered by a QuestBridge partner college to visit their campus, awards such as new laptop computers, and some students were invited to QuestBridge conferences at Stanford and Yale where participants attended workshops on how low-income students can successfully apply to leading colleges.
