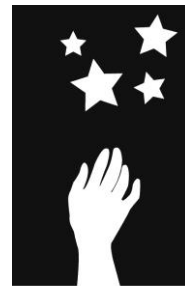


Davenport Schools Foundation Caryl Haring Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility Information:

This non-renewable scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from Davenport Community Schools who is intent on entering the **field of education** – as a teacher, administrator, counselor, coach, etc. The Haring Family seeks to reward a student who is passionate about being a teacher, and who will celebrate and demonstrate the profession's benefit to society every day, just as Mrs. Haring did throughout her life. The amount varies according to earnings.

Requirements:

This scholarship was created specifically for, and will be awarded to, students who have financial need. Candidates must have a GPA of 2.75 or higher. They must also submit the application, a letter of recommendation, a personal essay and the FAFSA Expected Financial Contribution (EFC) score.

Scholarship History:



The family of Caryl Lois Haring created this memorial scholarship in 2012. Mrs. Haring was a native Iowan who taught in Davenport Schools for 40 years, including a long period at Eisenhower Elementary. Her devotion to children and learning is reflected in her two degrees from Iowa Wesleyan College and Marycrest College, her membership in the NEA, and her Golden Apple Teaching Award. She retired in 1993 but continued working as a volunteer in the prisons, a guest teacher and storyteller in the schools, and as a performer for seniors at senior centers. She passed away in May 2012. Her daughter, Cynthia Haring, also a teacher, is scholarship coordinator.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
