The City hosted its second Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Day event on Saturday, June 8th from 9am–1pm at the Andrews Middle School.

Residents properly disposed of common household hazardous items, such as oilbased paints, lawn/garden chemicals, pesticides, batteries, fluorescent bulbs, gasoline/kerosene/diesel fuels and oil, household cleaners and more for a fee, payable by check or exact cash. This event has been made possible in part by grant funding through the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

This year, Run Medford introduces Jerry's Run for all Ages 5K Race, named after Jerry Panarese, who was a member of the New England 65+ Runners Club. Jerry was the director of the Run of All Ages for 25 years. In addition to the 5K, the event will also feature races for all ages, including a kids' fun run, 5-mile race, high school mile, VIP/Celebrity mile, and more.

Medford Residents Have Recycled 773 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in May

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 773 pounds of unwanted clothing in May.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.


