Happy summer! It's getting warmer outside and though many of you will be enjoying some well earned rest and relaxation, our work at City Hall is moving full steam ahead! We've been busy wrapping up some of our recent celebrations, including Pride Month, Juneteenth, lots of graduations, and more. We've also been making significant progress on a number of our parks projects - with the Gillis Park ribbon cutting scheduled for July 18 at 4pm and the partial reopening of Carr Park slated for July 19!

Here are a few more recent highlights:

- The City's Community Fund Committee awarded 36 grants to nonprofits that serve
 the Medford community last month. The awards totaled \$200,000 in funding to be

Park Project Updates



Gillis Park is ready to go and we're celebrating the official opening with a ribbon cutting ceremony on July 18 at 4pm!

The \$1.4 million renovation addressed two key issues: drainage and accessibility from the street and irrigation and grade corrections to make the park accessible from the sidewalk. You can read more about the project here and we hope to see you on the 18th!

Starting after July 18, the Carr Park Phase I renovation will be partially open to the public, including the loop path, pickleball courts, Stowers Ave path, and periphery areas. The central field will continue to be closed to the public until Spring 2025, due to the newly seeded field lawn which needs two growing seasons to establish. The City continues to ask that no one enter the fenced off field until it is open to the public. Walking or rolling on the lawn compacts the roots of the growing lawn, which has long-term maintenance consequences.

We broke ground this past January and when completed this space will offer several play opportunities and a variety of developmentally-appropriate challenges with inclusion at the forefront! There will also be a fully accessible and curriculum-

Fire Station Upgrades







Over the past year, crews have been diligently working to restore the floor deck, front

ramp, install new lockers and make updates to the garage door frames at the Engine 3 Fire Station at 276 Salem Street. The City secured \$650,000 in CDBG funding to make this project possible and now with the work nearing completion, firefighters will be able to move back into the facility this summer and to continue to serve the people of Medford from this newly renovated station. Special thanks to the firefighters, especially Brian Boyle who led the effort to assemble the lockers upon delivery!

Medford's Community Fund Committee Awards \$200,000 in Grant Funding to Medford-Focused Nonprofits



Through the City's Community Fund Committee, 36 nonprofits that serve the Medford community have been awarded \$200,000 in grant funding to be used to expand services, resources and outreach, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

In this round, applications increased by over 50 percent with requests totaling over \$600,000. With a limited amount of funding, the committee had to carefully analyze each submission and determine where the funding would have the most positive impact. At the end of the discussion process, the committee unanimously decided to award 36 nonprofits with funding.

City Hosting Kickoff Event for Electrify Medford Program

The City is hosting a kickoff event on July 31 from 5-7pm at the Medford Public Library for the start of the Electrify Medford outreach campaign to help residents learn about resources to make their homes more energy efficient, announced Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn. The Electrify Medford program helps residents save money on their energy bills and reduce their carbon footprint through energy efficiency, electrification, and solar home upgrades, with a focus on underrepresented and underserved communities.

The kickoff event will share resources about available programs and incentives. Electrify Medford coaches will be available to answer any questions and talk with people about their specific situations. There will also be fun activities for kids and light refreshments.

Medford Residents Have Recycled 1038 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in June

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 1038 pounds of unwanted clothing in June.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.

- Replacement of the existing concession stand with a new concession stand
- Brought the existing crosswalk along Fulton Street into ADA compliance




Congratulations to all of our 5th grade graduates who are moving on to middle school this fall!
