# Did You Know?

Missing school is much more than a missed day! Developing habits of timeliness will promote success in the future. **There is a clear correlation between student learning and consistent and prompt attendance in class.** Much of what our students learn is sequential. Therefore, learning requires regular attendance and effort. We also strongly believe that what occurs in class is vital to student learning. This means that even if students make up missed work, they have lost an opportunity for increased learning and skill development. They have missed the richness of class discussions, the exchange of ideas with peers and teachers, and the opportunity to defend their ideas. A great deal of classwork is done cooperatively, and a lack of attendance makes it difficult, if not impossible, for peers to successfully complete the work.

**How can parents and caregivers help?** Try to schedule appointments outside of school time, if possible. Support and encourage your student to have good attendance.

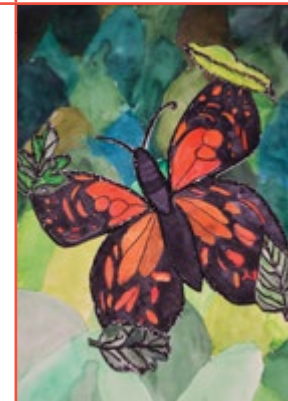

# Did You Know?

**Nearly two years ago, four students from Sun Prairie High School's ACCEL Global Business Academy met with District administrators to share their passion for improving financial education.** Through their school project, they researched student interest in financial literacy and ways to enhance it throughout high school. Currently, students meet the state requirement for financial literacy through our Economics course, a graduation requirement.

With financial support from the Bank of Sun Prairie and our dedicated educators, we expanded financial literacy offerings at all of our high schools. Since then, a team of educators, administrators, Bank of Sun Prairie representatives, and EverFi staff have worked together to plan and deliver the new lessons. The initial lessons were implemented at SP East, SP West, and PPA in April, during National Financial Literacy Month.

Feedback from students has shown that overall, the lessons are well-received. Students would like more information earlier in their education and more personal follow-up with banking staff on topics like loans and contracts. We will use this feedback to make improvements for the coming year!

# Did You Know?

**How do we decide when to cancel school?** If significant snow or ice makes roads dangerous, we may close or delay school. This decision is not taken lightly due to its impact on families and school operations. Here is our process:

- We close school if the National Weather Service issues a severe weather warning (winter storm, blizzard, or ice storm warning). If conditions are expected to improve by mid-morning, we may delay the start of school.
- We continue to monitor the National Weather Service and other weather sources.
- We consider the timing and amount of predicted snow or ice and its impact on student transportation.
- We work with Kobussen to ensure that bus routes are safe and passable.
- We coordinate with neighboring school districts to compare reports.

**A nutritious breakfast and lunch are essential for student learning.** We offer a variety of menu items, including fresh fruits and vegetables, homemade dishes, and unique cuisines. Every school features salad bars stocked with student-requested vegetables, promoting long-term healthy eating habits. Our Nutrition Team takes pride in preparing meals from scratch using fresh ingredients, some of which are grown right here in Sun Prairie. The Global Food and Sustainability Academy at SP East uses hydroponic systems to grow lettuce for the Nutrition Team to use in school lunches. This partnership provides a fantastic hands-on learning opportunity for our students and helps create a local, sustainable food source for our schools. We also collaborate with students to taste test and modify menu items, ensuring that our food options are student-centered and culturally diverse. # Did You Know?

**We offer free half-day 4-year-old kindergarten.** Our SP4K program is guided by curriculum and early learning standards that support the developmental needs of our youngest scholars. Each of our 4K classrooms is staffed with a licensed teacher and an instructional assistant who use a developmentally appropriate and play-based curriculum to support student growth in developmental skill areas. In addition, 4K students practice routines and learning behaviors that support the transition to kindergarten.

The Sun Prairie Area School District is proud to partner with local day care centers and preschool programs to offer 4-year-old kindergarten. We also have 4K classrooms in four of our elementary schools: Creekside, Northside, Meadow View, and Token Springs. All of our 4K sites follow the same curriculum. **In February, enrollment will begin for the 2025–2026 school year for any child who will be 4 years old by September 1, 2025.**

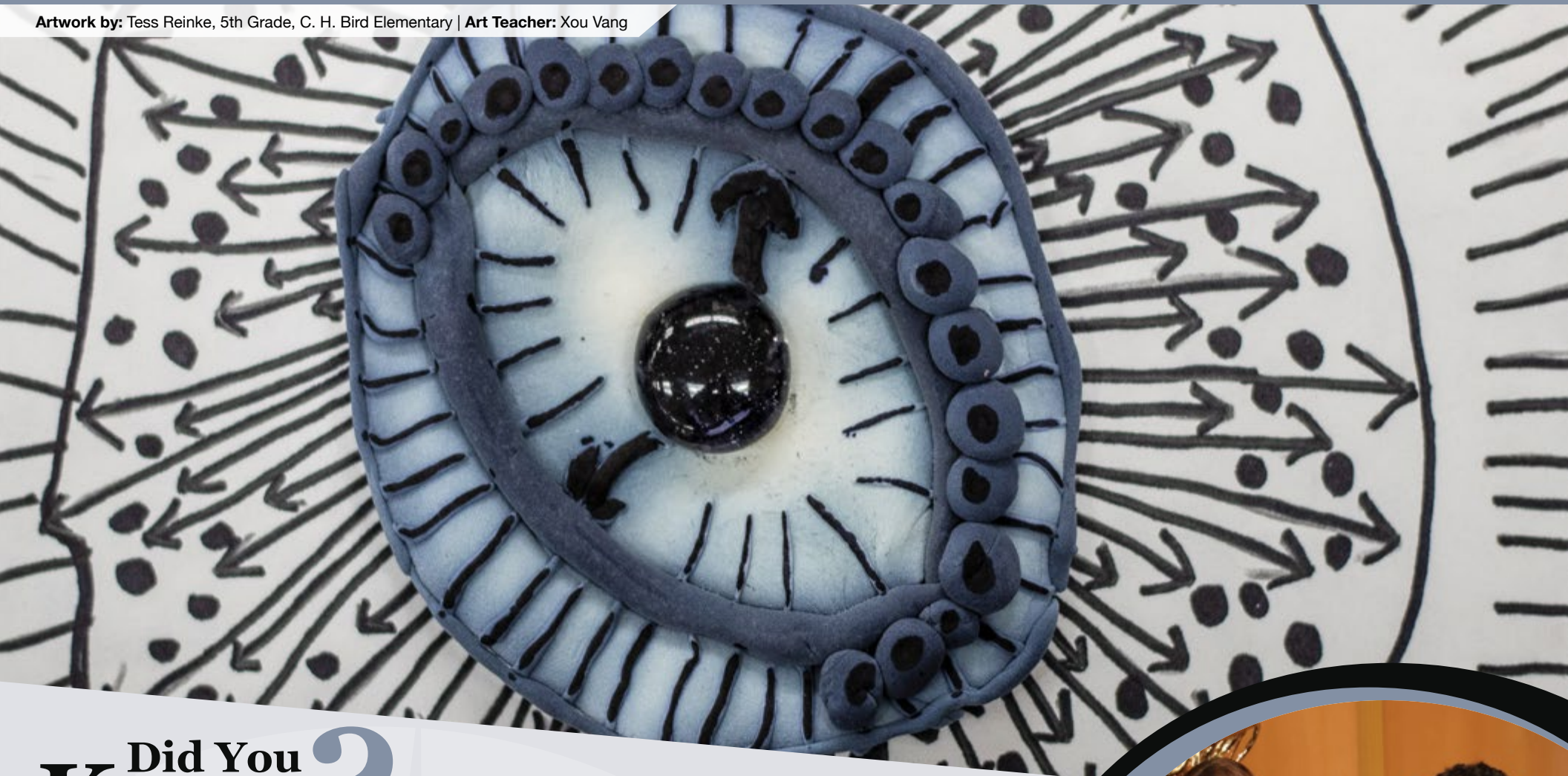

# Did You Know?

**Over 1,700 students in our District participate in our music programs each year**, including elementary, middle, and high school students. Each year, over 275 fifth-grade students start participating in orchestra, and over 400 sixth-grade students start participating in band and/or choir. In addition to the great performing band, choir, and orchestra ensembles at our middle and high schools, we offer general music classes to all students in grades K–12. These classes include General Music at all levels; Digital Music for eighth graders; and Digital Music Composition, Music in the Mainstream, and Music Theory at the high school level. # Did You Know?

**We support approximately 5,000 4K–12 students in our Summer School Program.** Through this program, we provide our youngest learners (4K) with an introduction to what school will be like in kindergarten and our oldest students (grades 9–12) with credit-earning classes. Students at all grade levels have the opportunity to strengthen their skills in math, reading, physical education, art, music, tech ed, and many other areas through a wide variety of enrichment classes that align with core content area standards. We also offer a robust strength and conditioning physical education program for students in grades 6–12. During Summer School, we invite teachers to use the outdoors as much as possible for their “learning laboratories.” Beyond the five-week summer school program, we offer additional classes in July and August in music, agriculture, theater, and orientation to our middle and high schools. **We have also added Dual Language Immersion (DLI) programming in alignment with DLI programs that are offered during the school year.** Sound of Sun Prairie is one of our largest summer programs with dozens of students in grades 8–12 participating in this extracurricular marching band. We are proud that the vast majority of our Summer School staff are teachers and support staff who work with our students during the regular school year.

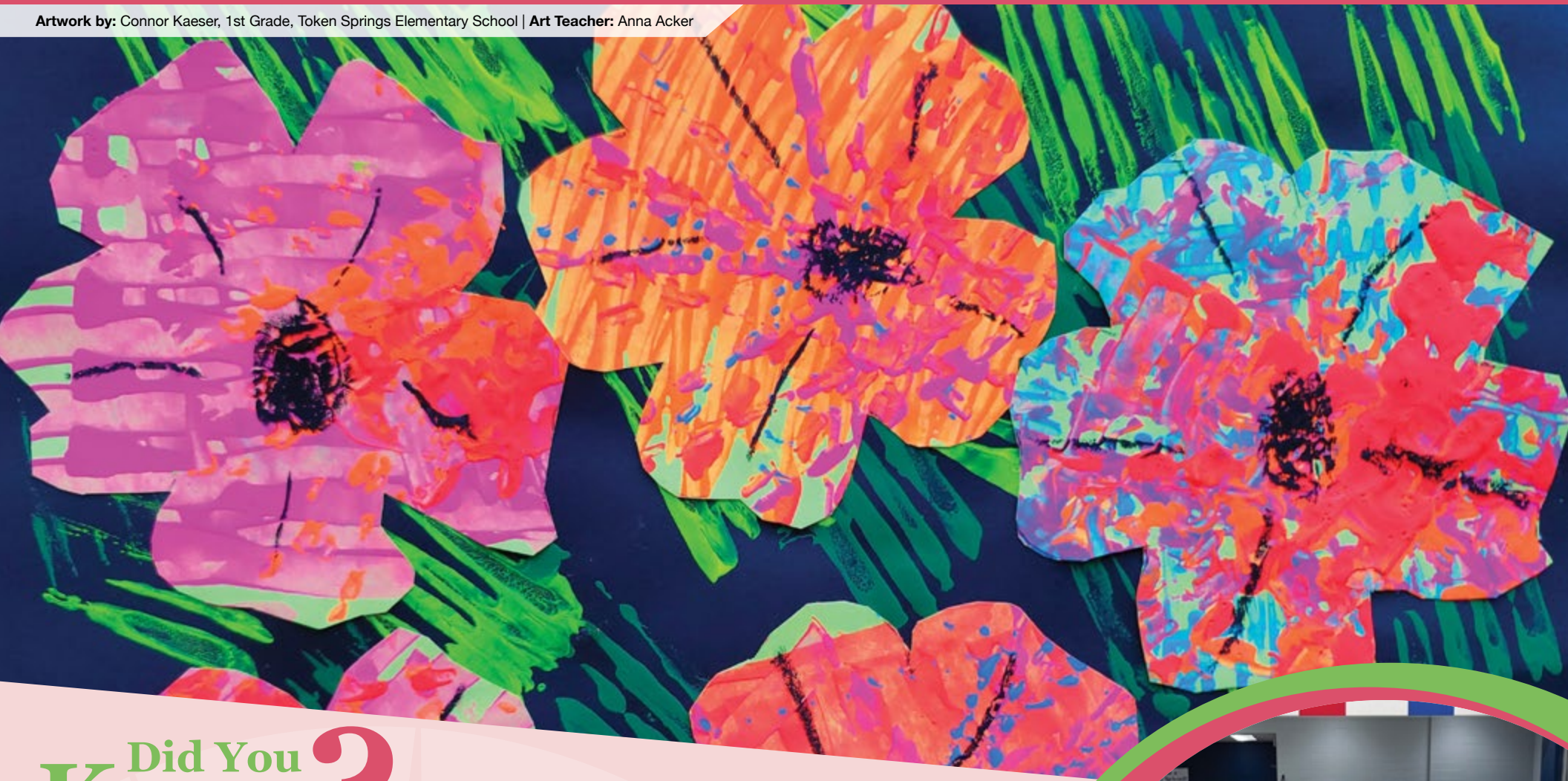

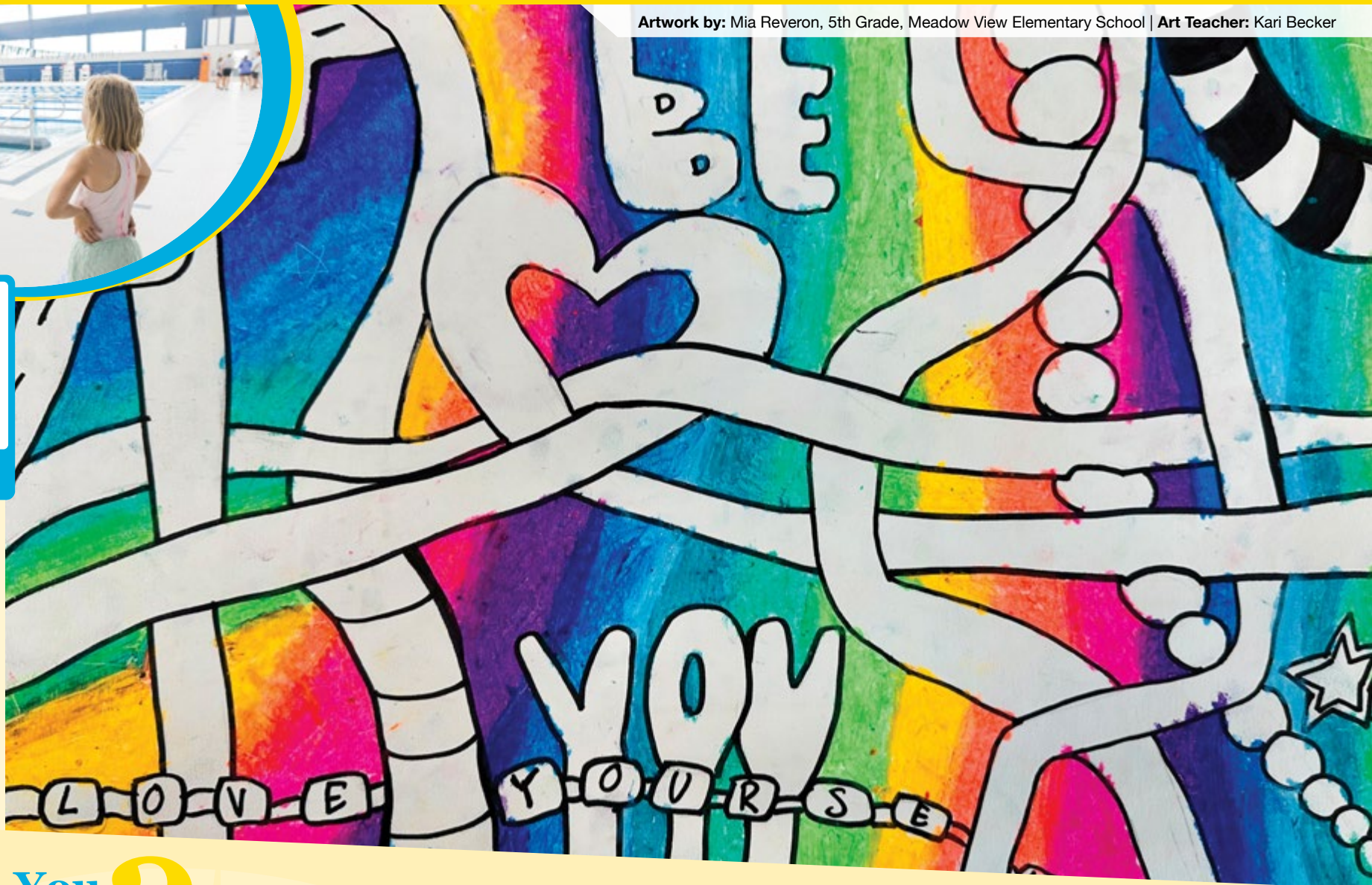

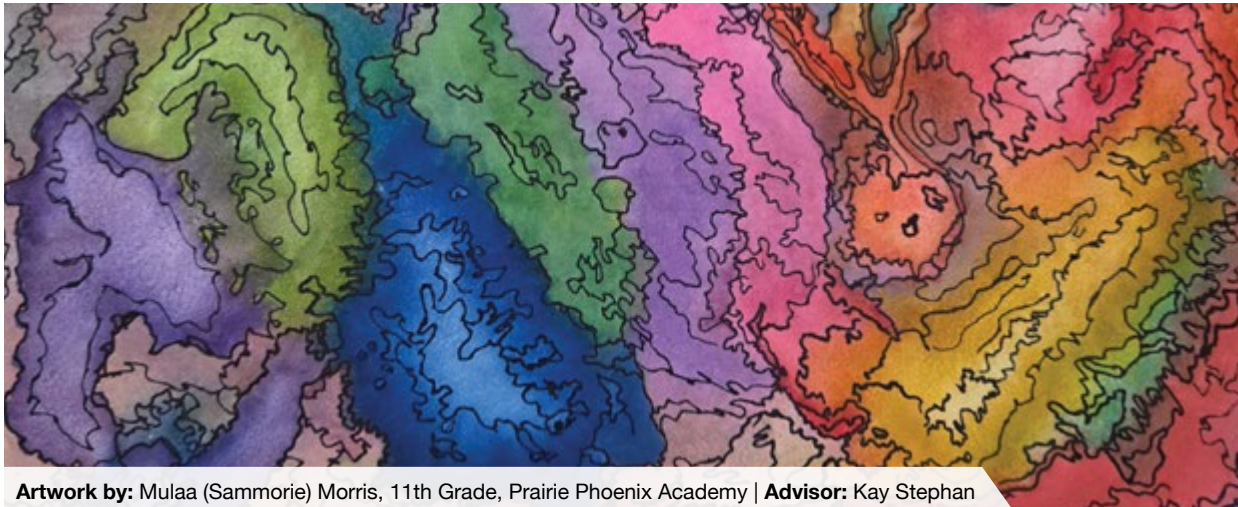
