Know?

Missing school is much more than a missed day! Developing habits of timeliness will promote success in the future. There is a clear correlation between student learning and consistent and prompt attendance in class. Much of what our students learn is sequential. Therefore, learning requires regular attendance and effort. We also strongly believe that what occurs in class is vital to student learning. This means that even if students make up missed work, they have lost an opportunity for increased learning and skill development. They have missed the richness of class discussions, the exchange of ideas with peers and teachers, and the opportunity to defend their ideas. A great deal of classwork is done cooperatively, and a lack of attendance makes it difficult, if not impossible, for peers to successfully complete the work.

How can parents and caregivers help? Try to schedule appointments outside of school time, if possible. Support and encourage your student to have good attendance.

Nearly two years ago, four students from Sun Prairie High School's ACCEL Global Business Academy met with District administrators to share their passion for improving financial education. Through their school project, they researched student interest in financial literacy and ways to enhance it throughout high school. Currently, students meet the state requirement for financial literacy through our Economics course, a graduation requirement.

With financial support from the Bank of Sun Prairie and our dedicated educators, we expanded financial literacy offerings at all of our high schools. Since then, a team of educators, administrators, Bank of Sun Prairie representatives, and EverFi staff have worked together to plan and deliver the new lessons. The initial lessons were implemented at SP East, SP West, and PPA in April, during National Financial Literacy Month.

Feedback from students has shown that overall, the lessons are well-received. Students would like more information earlier in their education and more personal follow-up with banking staff on topics like loans and contracts. We will use this feedback to make improvements for the coming year!








How do we decide when to cancel school? If significant snow or ice makes roads dangerous, we may close or delay school. This decision is not taken lightly due to its impact on families and school operations. Here is our process:

- We close school if the National Weather Service issues a severe weather warning (winter storm, blizzard, or ice storm warning). If conditions are expected to improve by mid-morning, we may delay the start of school.
- We continue to monitor the National Weather Service and other weather sources.
- We consider the timing and amount of predicted snow or ice and its impact on student transportation.
- We work with Kobussen to ensure that bus routes are safe and passable.
- · We coordinate with neighboring school districts to compare reports.





We support approximately 5,000 4K-12 students in our Summer **School Program.** Through this program, we provide our youngest learners (4K) with an introduction to what school will be like in kindergarten and our oldest students (grades 9-12) with credit-earning classes. Students at all grade levels have the opportunity to strengthen their skills in math, reading, physical education, art, music, tech ed, and many other areas through a wide variety of enrichment classes that align with core content area standards. We also offer a robust strength and conditioning physical education program for students in grades 6-12. During Summer School, we invite teachers to use the outdoors as much as possible for their "learning laboratories." Beyond the five-week summer school program, we offer additional classes in July and August in music, agriculture, theater, and orientation to our middle and high schools. We have also added Dual Language Immersion (DLI) programming in alignment with DLI programs that are offered during the school year. Sound of Sun Prairie is one of our largest summer programs with dozens of students in grades 8–12 participating in this extracurricular marching band. We are proud that the vast majority of our Summer School staff are teachers and support staff who work with our students during the regular school year.





Our state-of-the-art facilities benefit not only our students but also our entire community. We average 29,000 hours of public use of District facilities per year. This is spread among an average of 150 different locations inside and/or outside our buildings, including our swimming pools and multiuse Performing Arts Centers. During the 2023–2024 school year, there were only six non-holiday days when SPASD facilities were not being utilized for a community event.
