June 7, 2024, featured individual speeches by each of our fifteen graduates. They spoke with affection and gratitude for their teachers, the administration, and their friends. The graduates also highlighted their field trips, Outdoor Education experiences, and other unique PHS events.



These students spoke of the impact of PHS's six character qualities on their lives: of *persever-ance* and its crucial role especially during the pandemic months of online learning, of *caring* in building strong friendships, of *gratitude* in recognizing the achievements of classmates, of *respect* toward others which is almost always reciprocated, of *self-control* and its importance in the learning environment, and of *attitude* and maintaining a positive outlook even while enduring challenging times.

This is the only time that you are truly living, so don't waste it by thinking ahead and missing what is right in front of you.
