

SUSPENSION – TRANSPORTATION

A student who is insubordinate or disorderly or whose conduct otherwise endangers the safety, morals, health and/or welfare of others may have his transportation privileges suspended.

The Superintendent of Schools or designee shall prepare and issue such regulations (consistent with the laws, statutes and regulations of the State of New York) as necessary to establish procedures for the suspension of transportation privileges.

Building principals will have the power to suspend transportation privileges for infractions of rules of conduct for periods not to exceed five school days. The Board and/or Superintendent may suspend transportation for longer than the five days or permanently suspend a student's transportation privileges. In such cases, the Superintendent will afford the opportunity for a hearing, in compliance with the Education Law, with respect to the basis of such suspension, including any mitigating circumstances relating to the penalty.
