Hybrid Instructional Models vs. Remote Learning for Physical Distancing





- Remote learning takes place at home to provide the continuation of learning in their coursework without interruption, with both digital and non-digital items.
- The purpose of remote learning is to: Ensure the safety of students and staff; Maintain the school calendar by not adding emergency days at the end of the school year; Engage students in continuous learning.
- Remote Learning can occur synchronously with real-time interaction and collaboration, or asynchronously with self-paced learning activities.
