For the Heart of Your Child

Here are some ideas to support your child's appreciation for cultural differences:

- Share the history and background of your family. Are there any interesting customs that your family enjoys? Help your child write a short paragraph about your family's heritage to share with their class.
- On your next trip to the grocery store, take a few minutes to look at the wide variety of foods
 from many cultures and talk with your child about the different ethnicities in your community.
- Ask your child how he would want people to respond to him, if he were in a different country and looked different than the local folks.
- Discuss respectful behavior when you see someone dressed differently than you.

The more you talk with your child about having respect for others who are different, the more their heart (and yours) will grow!
