### Scholarship History:

This scholarship was created in 2011 by the family of Brian Keppy, a Davenport West High School alumnus who passed away in May 2011. The scholarship will be awarded to an individual who best represents Brian's devotion to academics and athletics.

### Eligibility:

Applicants must have graduated from Davenport West High School by June 30 of the current academic year while maintaining an overall GPA of at least 3.0. They must have participated in athletics for all four years of high school and shown dedication to the weight room.

### Letter of Recommendation and Transcript:

Applicants **must** provide a letter of recommendation from a teacher, administrator, coach or counselor, who is not a member of the Keppy Scholarship selection committee. A current transcript of grades is also required.

### Award:

The recipient will be announced at the West High School awards program in May. The amount of the award will vary according to available funding, with an expected minimum award of \$500 depending on the fund's investment performance in any given year.

### Selection Committee:

The following members will review applications and select the scholarship winner – Andy Zinn, a representative from West and a representative of the Keppy family.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
