

Why a Referendum Now?


- \$450-500M in deferred maintenance/improvement projects in the District 20 year plan
 - Determined through the work of ATS&R and Nexus Solutions
- Priority focus areas for November Referendum:
 - Safety, security, and ADA compliance issues at the secondary level
 - \circ $\,$ Schools impacted by consolidation $\,$

Declining Mill Rate Since 2017



*.26 cent increase due to Legislature allowing for low spending districts to increase revenue limit to \$11,000 per pupil - with no equalized aid - so increase resulted in slight tax increase

November 2024 Referendum - Mill Rate



Goal would be to hold mill rate at \$8.26 or lower

What's Driving Property Tax Increases?

- Public schools only government entity where mill rate is applied to Fair Market Value vs. Assessed Value
- Significant increases in Fair Market Values in recent years.
 - 2020 = 4.89% average increase
 - 2021 = 8.9% average increase
 - 2022 = 14.36% average increase
 - 2023 = 8.8% average increase
- In 2022 City of Green Bay reevaluated properties had not been done in more than a decade

What's Driving Tax Increases?



- Voucher costs increased by 30% from 2022 to 2023 year to \$11.5M (\$8.9M in 2023). Voucher payments are included as part of the levy amount, and make up 16.7% of the \$69M operational levy
- 1,107 students receive vouchers

Since 1993, Wisconsin school districts have been confined by state-imposed revenue limits, which were locked in at different amounts for each district depending on what they spent the prior year. The limits initially rose each year with inflation, but that provision was deleted in 2009, and any increases since have been left to the discretion of lawmakers.

Over the last 15 years, state lawmakers have not increased revenue limits to keep pace with inflation.

Safety & Security Concerns

- \$33M
- Secure entrances and security enhancements
- Bathroom renovations, which also include addressing ADA issues
 - Edison, Franklin, Lombardi, Washington, Red Smith, East, Preble, Southwest and West
- Relocation and security enhancements for N.E.W. School of Innovation at NWTC

School Consolidations

- \$150M
- Additions, renovations and deferred maintenance
- Beaumont, Chappell, Doty, Lincoln, Red Smith & new westside elementary
- Operations savings \$5M annually
- Deferred maintenance cost avoidance from school closings/consolidations
 - = \$67.8M (includes \$40M to replace MacArthur)
- Equitable spaces and greater operational efficiency
