# Capital Campaign Update

- 1. We are very close to having raised \$4,500,000!!
- 2. First Fruit Sunday, when everyone gave the first of their pledge, brought in \$897,000!!
- 3. A professional grant writer is in the process of applying for two separate ADEM grants.
- 4. The Development Committee is preparing proposals for 8 Charitable Trusts and Foundations that have all given to Episcopal causes with similar requests.



- 5. Any building materials for the school are purchased tax free no sales tax!
- 6. The church will receive for the campaign \$250,000 from the school fundraiser over the next 5 years.
- 7. The school is in the process of conducting their own campaign among parents, grandparents, and suppliers.
- 8. We have been offered in-kind gifts for example security, technology, and furnishings.

As you can see, the campaign has been very successful, but we need your help. We're excited to share that we have a handful of parishioners who have offered a matching grant opportunity. They will match up to a total of \$500,000 in new commitments to the campaign. Every dollar up to \$500,000 will be matched.

# An Update from Ellen Huckabay

I cannot believe that is has already been a year since we moved to Austin! Equally unbelievable is that my first year of seminary is behind me. What a year it has been for the entire Huckabay Family!

# An Update from Drew Downey

Grace and peace to y'all from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. It has been a busy year at Virginia Theological Seminary filled with new and exciting things as Chris and I move towards our final year in Alexandria. Last summer I completed my Clinical Pastoral Education at MedStar Washington in D.C. where I served as a chaplain. It was a formative experience visiting with the patients and families. Sometimes we would talk, and other times the most powerful thing was to not say anything; to let the grace and peace and God fill the room rather than words. Serving at MedStar Washington was a wonderful experience – and also, I am glad to have that requirement completed.

Classes have been intense and deeply rewarding. In the fall I took *Nicea and Chalecedon*, where we discussed an *easy* topic – the Trinity. I am joking of course. Our professor did offer a joke regarding the Trinity: there are 5 notions, 4 relations, 3 persons, 2 processions, 1 God, and 0 problems. Meaning there are zero problems attempting to understand the Trinity. It was a knee-slapper for sure.

Even with all the breaking-apart and discussion of the Triune God, there are still elements of mystery. I had the realization my attempts to explain God's infinite love with human words and thoughts is beyond my capacity sometimes.

This past January I took a class lead by Dr. Lisa Kimball, called *Camps, Conferences, and Retreats*. We talked about the intentions that guide us when forming a retreat, camp or conference. We discussed how a disruption of the everyday, intentional hospitality, being submerged in the divine, and variations of contemplative practices, are only a few aspects to consider when creating an event. It was an intense (only a weeklong) and rewarding class I'm glad I took. This past spring I took Historical Liturgy which was a fascinating and eye-opening class. It's cool, for lack of a better word, to try and connect these threads of how worship in the early church was formed, or how we think it was formed, and how it is developing. The big warning I take away from this class was to avoid universalizing interpretations and taking one particular account and assuming the entire Church was doing it.

All these classes energized my passion for discussing theology, God's love in our lives, and the understanding how our past is continuing to shape my theology of God's presence in our sacraments and worship.

At the beginning of the spring semester, I was selected to the be the lead sacristan for our chapel services at VTS. As a sacristan we have several responsibilities such as: caring for the vessels, marking the readings, and assisting liturgical leaders with training their team members. If you haven't thanked your altar guild today – be sure to. As Lead Sacristan I am responsible for these duties in addition to scheduling the other sacristans, running our weekly meetings, and communicating with the Associate Dean of Chapel. Some of my favorite times at VTS have been in the early mornings before our daily eucharist where I am alone in the chapel. I am also serving as the President of the Student Aid Society which assists students and their families with financial assistance in the event of an emergency. Both roles are wonderful opportunities to serve God and the VTS community.

Chris is doing well and still enjoying his job at Burke & Herbert Bank where he is the Assistant Branch Manager for one of the busiest branches. He will be going through a merger in a few months and is immersed with all the details to ensure a smooth transition. We're currently car shopping since we are sharing one vehicle and while manageable, there are some days where we both need to be somewhere different at the same time. Pray for us as we navigate the car market. In October we are planning a fall trip to Maine. We've never been before are are looking forward to being *leaf-peepers* and gorging on *lobstah* along the coast of Maine from Portland to Bar Harbor.

I am always appreciative of all your love, prayers, and financial assistance. Even this far north we are reminded of you all when we cover ourselves with the quilts St. James so graciously made for us. We are truly covering ourselves with your love. As August approaches I am also asking specifically for your prayers and love as I meet with the Commission on Ministry, Standing Committee, and Bishop Kendrick for my candidacy interview. I ask for your prayers of peace and courage as Chris and I continue walking the path towards God's call in our lives.
