NATURE OF THE WORK:

As the CTE Career Facilitator Teacher, you will play a crucial role in driving the success of initiatives aimed at leveling and enhancing secondary CTE programs. In this position, you will design, implement, and deliver effective strategies to achieve instructional goals, including coordinating and supporting programming that fosters career and college exploration for students. You will collaborate closely with various departments, including Finance, Assessment and Accountability, Student Services, Special Education, and Human Resources, as well as individual schools' staff and administration, to ensure seamless integration and maximum impact.

- Demonstrates exceptional interpersonal skills, with the ability to reach, advise, and collaborate with a wide range of learners and stakeholders, including students, parents, and colleagues
- Analyzes and interprets data to make informative decisions on student learning, professional development, and other areas
- Provides support in program implementation and prepares required reports in a timely manner, ensuring seamless project execution
- Coordinates instructional program initiatives in accordance with the Perkins Grant
- Collaborates with School Counselors, College and Career Liaisons, and central office leaders to support student postsecondary education and career interests
- Provides coaching and guidance to individual students, school staff, and school teams on initiatives identified in the Perkins Grant

- Facilitates collaborative team discussions, data-based decision-making sessions, including steering committees and PLC, to drive instructional goals and strategies
- Facilitate activities identified in the Perkins Grant between middle and high school sites
- Performs other related and non-related job duties as assigned
