



## THE HANAЕ FUJIIWARA WIESE MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP Central High School

Hanae Fujiwara was born in Tokyo, Japan in 1927 and received her teaching degree from a university in Japan in 1946. In 1951, she married John Wiese, an American soldier, and moved to the United States, where she continued her education while raising two fine sons. She received her teaching certificate from Marycrest College in 1968 and became a music teacher in Davenport for the next 20 years. After that, she taught the Japanese language in Iowa and Illinois high schools and Marycrest College until she developed cancer in 2002. She passed away in 2004.

Hanae loved the United States but always remained Japanese. Her life was family, education, and a love for her students and the world, with music and art always the center of her interests. Her two sons and grandchildren, all of whom were actively involved with music, graduated from Central High School. In her memory and to perpetuate Hanae's strong interest in music and education, her husband, John Wiese, established the Hanae Fujiwara Wiese Music Scholarship, beginning in 2005, as a reward and encouragement for outstanding music students graduating from Central High School.

The first award of \$500 was given in May 2005. For eight years, it was a one-time award. Starting in 2014, each recipient may be given up to \$4,000 over four years.

### Guidelines for Selection:

1. This is a music (vocal or instrumental) scholarship of approximately \$1,000 each for a male and female Central High School student graduating in the year that it is awarded. Starting in 2014, it can repeat for all four years of college, if the recipient maintains a 3.0 GPA and provides proof of enrollment in school by June 1st. The award may vary depending on the fund's investment performance in any given year.
2. The students selected should hold music as a high priority in their daily lives, evidenced by participation and leadership in the field of music.
3. The students must have a minimum GPA of 3.25, or a 24 ACT result. They must graduate from Central High School by June, and demonstrate scholastic achievement, extracurricular activities, community involvement and participation in CHS music program(s). Their records must indicate that they will do well in college.
4. Verification of enrollment in an accredited 2- or 4-year college in the USA must be provided.
5. This is an award for what a student has accomplished up to this time.
6. Need for aid will be given high consideration.
  - a. Selections will be made by a designated committee from the Central High Music Department staff. **There is no application process. By April 15** the committee will send the name of the recipient, his/her address and phone number, and the name of his/her parents to the Davenport Schools Foundation, Attn: Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
