Students who earn this non-licensure degree will have the option of working with students in a setting that does not require teacher licensure, (e.g. educational support services or non-profit organizations), obtaining teacher licensure post-baccalaureate through a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) or alternative licensure process, or pursuing graduate work in a non-teaching field.
