December 2023 marked the 10th anniversary of the Tree Lighting Ceremony. An event inspired by the inclusive ambiance of Rockefeller Center's tree lighting gathering people from diverse backgrounds, Ms. Young proposed a tree lighting ceremony on October 15, 2014. Her vision extended beyond a mere event—it encompassed an evening filled with activities. Clubs would sell or give out hot chocolate and cider, and the music department would contribute performances, fostering a vibrant community atmosphere of joy and giving.

The first year witnessed a remarkable turnout, reflecting the success of Ms. Young's idea. However, by 2015, concerns emerged regarding the separation of church and state. A heartfelt email raised questions about cultural sensitivity, sparking a community conversation. Resolute in their commitment, Mr. Loeschner and legal counsel affirmed that the tree lighting was an evening event and the tree itself was not a religious symbol, allowing the tradition to continue.

The resilience of the tradition shone during the 2020 pandemic when a drive-thru tree lighting offered a safe yet festive experience. In 2021, secured funding elevated the event with a grand 14-foot commercial tree. Beyond the tree lighting, the celebration expanded to include diverse activities such as candy cane giveaways, Toys for Tots, raffles, book giveaways, fundraising, animal farms, letter writing, fun activities, and talent showcases.

Thank you to all contributors who have played a pivotal role in preserving and enhancing this rich and meaningful tradition. The Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony is all about bringing the community together.




