Guide to Student Conduct:

 CHS teachers and administration use the St. Bernard Parish Public Schools' Student & Family Handbook as a resource to follow school board procedures.

 This document contains information including registration, attendance, dress code, discipline, health and medical policies, and many other topics.

 Mandatory parent signature forms must be signed and returned at the beginning of each school year.



Structure of the academy building:

- Academy building contains three floors
- Academy teachers and students are divided into teams... Floor 1, Floor 2, Floor 3, or Floor 4
- Most ninth grade classes are taught on the Academy Campus providing students with a smaller campus to navigate in the ninth grade year



Teaming:

- Academy teams meet three times a week to discuss academics, behaviors, and attendance.
- Weekly academy teams select Students-of-the-Week to recognize student successes.
- Academy teams meet with students to discuss academic and behavioral successes and frustrations.



Communication:

- Academy teachers and administrators teach students expectations and procedures. This includes building entry, lunch room, courtyard, hallways, and classroom procedures that are expected to be followed daily.
- Academy teams and administration communicate with parents via School Status.
- Academy teachers post curricular information on Canvas that can be accessed by all students in-person and remotely through Clever.
- Academy teams set-up conferences with students, parents/guardians, and counselor as they or the parent feels they are needed.



High Expectations: Dress Code, Attendance, Discipline.

- Students should arrive daily in full uniform with ID.
- Students should arrive on time daily. Students must be in homeroom by 7:30am in order to avoid negative consequences for tardiness.
- Students must meet State Attendance Requirements. Louisiana Department of Education requires students to attend school 83.5 days per semester to be eligible for credits earned.
- Students are expected to follow the district discipline policies.
- Teachers use discipline referrals to acclimate students to high school and to teach students appropriate behaviors while receiving consequences for misbehavior.
