WORK SESSION AND REGULAR MEETING MINUTES SEPTEMBER 25, 2017

The Asheville City Board of Education ("Board") held a work session at 4:00 p.m., on Monday, September 25, 2017, in Room 233 at Montford North Star Academy, 90 Montford Ave, Asheville, NC

CALL TO ORDER

Board Chair Shaunda Sandford called the work session to order at 4:04 p.m.

AGENDA

Shaunda Sandford made a motion to amend and approve the work session agenda for the reasons below. The motion was seconded by Joyce Brown and carried.

Work Session Presentations

- 1. Dr. Chance Lewis, Professor at UNC Charlotte, and Executive Director of the Urban Education Collaborative program, presented.
- His program is dedicated to disseminating the next generation of research on the improvement
 of teaching and learning in urban schools. He wants to work with Asheville City schools to
 provide high quality training that can be used and put into action.
- Ultimate goal is to extend the curriculum outside of the classroom so that students know how to apply what they have learned outside of school.
- He mentioned two of his books that he uses as some of the tools for the teachers. "Educators
 Guide to Working with African American Students" and "White Teachers in Diverse Classrooms".
 These books list different scenarios, from court services to speaking with parents.
- Build key parent and community partnerships that are essential to our students.

- 2. Marsha Lipe, Director of Testing and Accountability, provided an update on Accountability for the 2016/2017 school year, and shared the following information with the Board:
- Results from the 2016/2017 school year. She presented a slide show and showed the four year data trend for ELA/Reading, Math, and Science by grade and by school for 2013-2014 to 2016-2017. 2013-2014 through 2016-2017 data

- Standards of Indicators: Graduation Rate, Math Course Rigor, percent of graduates who successfully complete NC Math III; The ACT; and ACT Work Keys.
- School Performance Grades and Growth.
- 3. Taylor Baldwin, Director of Career and Technical Education "CTE", presented to the Board an over view of what CTE is and why it is important.
- CTE links students to the "real-world" using instructional strategies like work-based learning
 opportunities in ways that many other high school programs cannot. -There is a growing need
 for credentials, postsecondary education and training after high school. Research shows that
 CTE students are more engaged in their education, graduate from high school at higher rates
 and score higher on academic achievement tests.
- Career and technical education in Asheville City Schools consist of approximately sixty elective
 courses in the following eight program areas: Business, Career Development, Family and
 Consumer Sciences, Health Occupations, Manufacturing, Technology Education and Trade and
 Industrial Education. Twenty One CTE teachers provide instruction for students grades six
 through twelve.
- Legislative updates: Each local school administrative unit shall offer as part of its career and technical education program at least two work-based learning opportunities that are related to career and technical education instruction. Each local board of education is encouraged to implement a career awareness program for students in grade five to educate students on the career and technical education programs offered in the local school administrative unit.
- Drivers ed online: Covers the state and national standards required for drivers' education. Students must be in Grades 9-12 and 14.5 years of age before enrolling in this course.
- 4. Dr. Eric Howard, Director of Student Services: Mental Health Update
- Working with school based staff to develop strategies to implement and report our mental health services throughout the district. Creating access to the families for medication and therapeutic services.
- With this transition some of the challenges are that there will no longer be day treatment.
 Exceptional Children services moved away from providing one on one support, therefore mental health needs to bring in more staff members for provide one on one support, which he is working on getting. Providing wrap around support to students and their families will make this program strong and it is what it needs.
- 5. Don Sims, Director of Maintenance, discussed annual lead paint review at the schools.
 - No student is in harm of any kind due to lead paint.
 - Three inspectors inspected the school campuses: two from Buncombe County and one from the state. They have multiple ways of testing. Any area where a student could reasonably be had to be inspected.
 - If lead paint is found, the school system is required to remove the paint all of the way down to the metal. Several door frames ended up with lead paint and maintenance workers/ environmental contractors were able to go in and remove the lead paint down to the metal of the effected door frames. For other areas where students are not present, the areas can be encapsulated so that lead is not exposed.

6. Dr. Patterson

• Work session/Board session meeting dates review: schedule was brought to be reviewed and then to be decided during the next Board meeting on October 2nd.

7. Dr. Patterson, Field Trip Procedure update:

- Policy Code 3320; School Trips was reviewed to make sure schools were following it.
- No one made any recommendations to the policy. The Superintendent approves any field trips that are out of state, overnight, and in excess of 300 miles round trip. Central office makes sure that field trips are aligned with the curriculum.
- Principals are heavily involved in the planning process for field trips. Principals, assistant
 Principals, Shane Cassida, Dr. McAllister, and Ms. Hedt were on the committee to review the
 field trip policies.

8. Dr. Patterson reviewed Policy Code 1025: District Organizational Plan.

 Dr. Patterson did recommend revisions. The last time this policy was revised was October 22, 2007. Some of the schools listed on this policy are no longer in Asheville City Schools. Board will review the changes that are needed then approve at the next Board meeting. This will be an item on the November 6, 2017 Board Meeting for review. No action was taken.

Dr. Patterson reviewed the Calendar for 2017-2018 Make-Up Days:

- September 12, 2017 off from work due to inclement weather.
- September 12, 2017 became an annual leave day.
- October 30, 2017 became a student make up day.
- November 22, 2017 became an optional work day instead of an annual leave day.

Field Trips: Overnight Trips-

- Jones Elementary, 4th Grade Students, Field Trip to visit the Earth Shine Discovery Center in Lake Toxaway, NC. It does correlate with their school improvement plan. This trip is in the pre-planning stages and parents have not been informed yet. Principals can turn in their chaperone lists after the board has approved the trip.
- Jones Elementary, 5th Grade Students, Field Trip to Washington, D.C. It does correlate with their school improvement plan. All students will be able to go because PTA funds will be used for scholarships for students.
- Claxton Elementary, 4th Grade Students, Field Trip to Raleigh, NC. It does correlate with their school improvement plan.
- Claxton Elementary, -----Washington D.C. It does correlate with their school improvement plan.
- List of students are included who require medical attention along with their medications. Whoever is on the trip is also aware of these students and are able to administer the medication to the students as needed.
- The Board Chair Ms. Sandford and Dr. Patterson signed off on the above listed field trips.

Dr. Patterson presented the Nurse Contracts for the Board to review.

• The school system will be working Mountain Area Health Education Center, to make sure that school system principals and building administrators are clear to the roles of the school nurse and that the needs of the schools are addressed by the school nurse as well.

Superintendent Patterson shared the following district information/events:

- Ms. Graves, the Executive Director of Human Resources, coordinated the recognition of the Asheville City Schools teacher of the Year celebration. Rebecca Wertheim is a second grade teacher at Claxton Elementary School, she was presented with a surprise ceremony to receive her teacher of the year award.
- Ashley- Michelle Thublin, Executive Director of Community Relations/Communications has created a strong presence in social media for our schools. With our Twitter, #ACSWAY, and Facebook. Also she is facilitating our United Way Campaign as well.
- Dr. McAllister, Assistant Superintendent, will be facilitating the first assistant principal training of the year. Our goal is to provide training to our district leaders in areas of budget, teacher development and curriculum support.
- Mr. Shane Cassida, Curriculum and Student Resources Executive Director, he has been collaborating with the gifted teachers, core counselors and social workers to support our schools, students and leaders.
