# Dr. Patterson's Vision for Asheville City Schools

My vision for Asheville City Schools is to provide a rigorous learning environment for each child that personalizes learning. We will focus on helping each child develop by meeting their social, emotional, mental, physical, behavioral, and academic needs. We want our students to participate in experiences to learn and discover leadership skills so they thrive in college and their career.

# **Core Principles for Excellence**

We continue to focus on our core principles: Positive, Professional, Problem Solver, Collaborator, and Excellence

Because of the vision and core principles, it is important that our schools and district office reflect clean places to learn and work. A major emphasis has been placed on making sure our students and staff attends safe, clean schools. The maintenance staff has been working extremely hard to address needs inside and outside of the buildings.

A special thanks to Kristy Coats and Kimberly Jones for assisting with the beautification of our district office. This is often the first place where families visit, and we want them to have a welcoming and inviting experience to our school district office.

# **Excellence with Equity in Asheville City Schools**

Our focus is on collaborating in our school and district teams. I have participated in Isaac Dickson's equity team collaboration and our district team collaboration. We have had powerful and courageous conversations about the gap in student achievement, goals to improvement learning, analysis of resources, and open communication about our personal and professional experiences.

These conversations have led me to develop my own vision around equity in our district. First, we will be moving forward with the equity initiative. The term ICS Work no longer exists. The phrase felt like and had the appearance that we were doing something to check off of our list. While we will continue with the modules and collaboration with Dr. Frattura and Dr. Capper, we will implement the term Excellence with Equity. This is a process and a way of thinking to enhance learning experiences for our students. It is not work. Rather, it is how and what we learn, discover, and do for our students to learn and our staff to grow.

## School Visits and Collaboration with Principals

From visiting classrooms, observing instruction, and assisting administration, the district office staff has had a strong presence in our schools this year. Additionally, the leadership team is in the process of visiting each principal at their assigned school to determine how to further support Principals especially in this last portion of the school year. We have met with the following principals: Dr. Dingle, Asheville High School; Dr. Robinson, SILSA; Principal Baggett, Montford North Star Academy, Principal Sellinger; Hall Fletcher Elementary School; and Principal Dockery, Asheville Middle School.

# Leadership Asheville Forum

Collaboration between Leadership Asheville and Leadership Asheville Seniors hosted an event to discuss school safety and the prevention of tragic events in schools. In addition to me, the panel was also comprised of J. Hough, Buncombe County Schools, and Representative Susan Fisher. Questions from the audience around school safety resulted in our responses about drills and how we will continue to keep our schools safe for our students, staff, visitors, and volunteers.

### AdvancED

Our AdvancED visit will begin Sunday, April 22nd through Wednesday, April 25th. A group of educators from North Carolina and across the United States will visit our district office and schools. This visit occurs every five years. The purpose is to conduct an in depth visit to help our schools focus on continuous improvement.

Melissa Hedt has facilitated our process and a special thank you goes to all of our staff for their commitment to ensure we are ready for the visit.

# Safety Update

You have probably viewed my recordings about school safety; these videos were created in collaboration with our district safety team. We wanted to provide our families and community with information about what we were currently implementing (fire drills, lockdowns, etc.) and future plans such as adding more cameras. Our camera committee met and reviewed our camera audit. We do have a plan to purchase cameras this year and next year. Finally, we continue to collaborate with the police and fire departments.

## American Association of University Women

I will be the guest speak at the luncheon on Thursday, April 24th. The mission of the organization is to promote equity among women and girls. This is promoted through education, philanthropy, advocacy, and research. I will be sharing our goals and initiatives in Asheville City Schools.
