4. ESSERS - Title I Update:

Peyton O'Conner made a motion to approve option three of the Retention Bonus. Shaunda Sandford seconded the motion. Martha Geitner opposed the motion. The motion passed 4-1. Peyton O'Conner made a motion to include with the approved Option three of the Retention Bonus Incentive an additional \$500.00 to line one Classified full-time Staff who work 30 hours or more for a total of \$3,500.00; to line two an additional \$1,000.00 to Certified full-time Staff who work 30 hours or more for a total of \$3,000.00. George Sieburg seconded the motion to add the additions to the approved option three. The motion passed unanimously.

GOOD NEWS:

Ashley-Michelle Thublin, Executive Director of Communication presented:

- Mrs. Abby Mulchay, Asheville Middle School is the ACS 2021-2022 Teacher of Excellence.
- Ms. Eugenia Floyd, the NC State Teacher of the year, had the opportunity to tour both Ira B. Jones and the High School campuses during her Western NC Schools visit.
- The Asheville High School Theater Department performed a show in the art theater! Our students performed *Radium*, November 6-8, 2021. *Radium* is the story of 1920s factory workers and the complications they faced after being exposed to radium poisoning.
- <u>Claxton Elementary School</u> students ran up to 35 laps as part of their Fun Run! This fundraiser was to raise \$40,000 for cultural enrichment programs, field trip scholarships, teacher appreciation giveaways, books, and classroom supplies. According to Principal Mary Nichols, the Claxton Leaders exceeded their goal, collecting \$48,000!
- Groundhogs Asheville High School's student-run cafe is officially open!
- Asheville High School hosts a 2nd Round playoff game for football on November 12, 2021. The
 last time AHS hosted a playoff game for football was in 2014. The varsity football team will be
 playing Mallard Creek.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Human Resources

 Call Me Mister partnership with Western Carolina University. WCU is offering AHS/SILSA 1 to 2 scholarships for male students of color who are pursuing education as

- a career. WCU will be joining Dr. Dechant each month at AHS/ SILSA to recruit for this scholarship(s).
- Future Teacher Recruitment at AHS/SILSA begins on Tuesday, November 16, from 11:30 in the cafeteria. The Human Resources Department has started a new recruitment initiative with our partnering universities. We are working collaboratively to recruit our high school students to pursue teaching as a career and being intentional in recruiting our students of color. We are also using this opportunity to recruit students for our Pathways2Teaching class at AHS/SILSA for the 2022-2023 school year.

• Finance

o Georgia's team continues to analyze and provide budget feedback to the BOE.

• C&I

- We are meeting with principals to prepare for data dives as well as facilitating data dives with each individual principal to dig into first-quarter academic and assessments, behavior, and attendance data. Planning for remote instruction during inclement weather.
- Created a survey for staff feedback about ESSER bonuses.
- Georgia's team continues to analyze and provide budget feedback to the BOE.

Maintenance

- Capital evaluation will be complete in January so we can begin 2022-2023 capital needs.
- Kristy Coats met with the Jones parents and administration regarding the 3-5 playground. We are waiting on a revised quote.
- Work on the Lucy S. Herring auditorium wall will begin the week of Thanksgiving.
- The grounds crew is currently at Jones trimming bushes and mulching. They will be working at a school approximately every 2 weeks.
- Roof repairs are happening across our campuses.
- Preventative maintenance for chillers is being reviewed by attorneys and we will hopefully have this in place by the end of November.

• EC

- Our Elementary and Middle EC teachers are implementing specially designed instruction through a variety of research-based programs to meet the academic and functional IEP goals of our students across a variety of settings. Social-Emotional curriculums are being utilized to support the varying needs of many of our students with IEPs.
- Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training is taking place for Asheville Middle School EC staff and several of the EC staff from AHS.
- Students on the Occupational Course of Study Diploma pathway have started community-based training through a community opportunity at RiverLink at Carrier Park.
- Our Job Coach and OCS staff are working to secure additional training opportunities that align with the student's transition goals.
- This week is National School Psychologist week! Shout out to ours: Kelly Weller, Dr. Candrice Thul, Meg Deal, and Jeffrey Kilpatrick.
