#### CALL TO ORDER

George Sieburg, Board Chair, called the session to order at 5:04 p.m.

The Board would like to recognize that we have students at the request of the Student Government Association at Asheville High and SILSA. We also have students from the ICC. We will have space for students going forward.

### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

George Sieburg made a motion to approve the agenda. James C. Carter motioned to approve the agenda. Amy Ray seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### INFORMATION AGENDA

- Student Releases to Buncombe County 2022-2023: Tanya Presha, Academic and Program Support Coordinator presented for approval a list of students who live within the Asheville City Schools District who have requested a release from Asheville City Schools.
- Draft <u>Equity Statement and Working Definition</u>: Marta Alcalá, Executive Director of Equity and Parent Engagement presented an Equity Statement that will be read to the audience before each board meeting and shared the live working district equity definition.
- 2023-24 Budget Process Status: Dr. Causby presented an updated and mentioned that there will be a public hearing to hear the County Manager's recommended budget with be on Tuesday, June 7th. The district does not plan to speak. It's up to the employees and the public to share their feedback. The commission is scheduled to adopt a budget on June 20th. Once the budget is approved then ACS can look at what adjustments we may need to make to balance with that number. One other thing we have to know is the state's final budget. The State's budget and the House budget are radically different. They are now in conference with each other and it is being said that they are in agreement on a salary. They are not disclosing any information because they have some major differences in other areas. It is being said that the Senate has lowballed the salaries. They have a few things they want in order to increase salaries. They want to have state-sanctioned casinos and some sports betting items. This is what Dr. Casuby is hearing from the inside. It may be July before they finalize a budget. At that time district staff can work on a recommendation that combines both budgets and see how you want to move forward.
- Proposed Resolution to Prioritize Public Schools in 23-25 Biennial Budget: Dr. Causby presented a resolution from Governor Roy Cooper's Office. The resolution asks that the NC General Assembly prioritize public schools by
  - Making significant investments in teacher salary increases
  - Significant investments in early childhood education and childcare
  - Stopping the unlimited expansion of the state's private school voucher program
- <u>BE SMART MOU:</u> Dr. Causby presented the agreement between BE SMART and the Asheville City Board of Education.
