SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

FINANCE

- December payroll checks have been processed and will be paid to all employees on December 19th.
- The January payroll will remain the same and folks will receive checks on January 31, 2023.

MAINTENANCE

 The unit ventilators are onsite at Hall Fletcher Elementary and ready to be installed during the holiday break.

- A new high-efficiency boiler should arrive at Hall Fletcher Elementary soon to be installed in January.
- Building G, the new building at Asheville High will open in January.
- New attic fans have been installed at Asheville High School and should be up
- and running by the end of the week.

EQUITY

- In partnership with the Asheville City Schools Foundation, students from Asheville High and SILSA participated in a two-day workshop from the Racial Equity Institute. This is an excellent
- Opportunity for students to explore and discover a deeper analysis of History, Civics, Economics, Psychology, and Justice.

CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

- We are finalizing preparations for Remote Learning Days for inclement weather. A website has been created that houses all of the resources for Remote Learning on Inclement Weather Days. Choice boards are completed for each grade K-5 (color-coded by grade) and students will be taking those home before the winter break. The website also includes links to optional enrichment activities. Students in grades 6-12 will complete assignments on our learning management system, Canvas.
- We are preparing for open enrollment. The elementary magnet school night will be January 12, 5:30-8:00 pm at Asheville Middle School. Open enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year is from Feb. 6-Mar. 13, 2023.
- We are planning for summer programming in 2023! Summer program dates will be solidified by January and the lead for each program will be identified by February.
- CTE: The CTE department has created a <u>Career Development Framework</u> and a <u>Career Development Continuum</u>. CTE has also created a <u>CTE Month Activities</u> plan for February.
- Exceptional Children: <u>Headcount is complete</u>! We currently have 532 students qualifying for our services. That is approximately 13% of our district's student population.
- Technology: The Newline classroom display installation is not yet scheduled but coming in the new year. The total project for AHS/SILSA, Jones, Claxton, Herring, Montford, and Hall Fletcher is expected to take 6 weeks or less (1 week for most schools and 2 or more for AHS/SILSA).
